JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States extending the right to vote to citizens sixteen years of age or older.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled (two-
- 3 thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
- 8 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 9 for ratification:

1	"ARTICLE —
2	"Section 1. The twenty-sixth article of amendment
3	to the Constitution of the United States is hereby re-
4	pealed.
5	"Section 2. The right of citizens of the United
6	States, who are sixteen years of age or older, to vote shall
7	not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any
8	State on account of age.

9 "Section 3. The Congress shall have power to en-

10 force this article by appropriate legislation.".
