## A BILL

To amend section 111 of the Clean Air Act to clarify when a physical change in, or change in the method of operation of, a stationary source constitutes a modification, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. CLARIFICATION OF DEFINITION OF A MODI-
- 4 FICATION.
- 5 Paragraph (4) of section 111(a) of the Clean Air Act
- 6 (42 U.S.C. 7411(a)) is amended by adding at the end the
- 7 following: "For purposes of the preceding sentence, a
- 8 physical change in, or change in the method of operation

1	of, a stationary source increases the amount of any air
2	pollutant emitted by such source only if the maximum
3	achievable hourly emissions rate of such source after the
4	change will be higher than—
5	"(A) the maximum achievable hourly emis-
6	sions rate of such source as it was originally de-
7	signed; and
8	"(B) the maximum hourly emissions rate
9	of such source that was actually achieved dur-
10	ing the 10-year period preceding such change.".
