## AS PASSED SENATE

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 3 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to state and other flags, so as to designate the Honor and Remember flag as the state's
- 3 emblem of the service and sacrifice of the members of the armed forces; to provide for the
- 4 display of the Honor and Remember flag at designated state-owned properties on certain
- 5 designated days; to provide that such flags are manufactured in the United States; to provide
- 6 that local governments may display the Honor and Remember flag; to provide for the
- 7 adoption of guidelines for the display of such flags; to provide for the procurement and
- 8 distribution of such flags; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for
- 9 other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- SECTION 1.
- 12 Article 1 of Chapter 3 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to state
- and other flags, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 14 "50-3-14.
- 15 (a) The Honor and Remember flag is designated as the state's emblem of the service and
- sacrifice of the brave men and women of the United States armed forces who have given
- 17 <u>their lives in the line of duty.</u>
- 18 (b) The Honor and Remember flag may be displayed, in a manner designed to ensure
- 19 <u>visibility to the public:</u>
- 20 (1) At the following locations:
- 21 (A) Any state-owned building at which the United States flag is displayed;
- 22 (B) Any state-owned military memorials; or
- (C) Any other state-owned location;
- 24 (2) On the following days:
- 25 (A) Armed Forces Day, the third Saturday in May;
- 26 (B) Memorial Day, the last Monday in May;

- 28 (D) Independence Day, July 4;
- 29 (E) National POW-MIA Recognition Day, the third Friday in September;
- 30 (F) Veterans Day, November 11;
- 31 (G) Gold Star Mother's Day, the last Sunday in September; and
- 32 (H) A day on which a member of the United States armed forces who is a resident of
- 33 the state loses his or her life in the line of duty; and
- 34 (3) With no more than two additional flags when displayed together on a flagpole.
- 35 (c) A flag displayed pursuant to this Code section must be manufactured in the United
- 36 States.
- 37 (d) A local government may display the flag in accordance with subparagraphs (b)(2)(C)
- and (b)(2)(D) of this Code section at any local government building at which the United
- 39 States flag is displayed and at any other local government location it deems appropriate.
- 40 (e) Any department or agency responsible for a location specified in paragraph (1) of
- 41 <u>subsection (b) of this Code section, or a local government pursuant to subsection (d) of this</u>
- 42 <u>Code section, may adopt guidelines as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Code</u>
- 43 <u>section, provided that such guidelines may not require an employee to report to work solely</u>
- 44 to display the flag.
- 45 (f) After July 1, 2019, the Department of Administrative Services may begin procurement
- and distribution of the flag as necessary to comply with this Code section."

47 SECTION 2.

48 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
