A BILL

- To promote the general health and well-being of individuals accessing work through digital marketplace companies, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Helping Gig Economy

5 Workers Act of 2020".

6 SEC. 2. DIGITAL MARKETPLACE COMPANY SAFE HARBOR.

- 7 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:
- 8 (1) COVID-19 EMERGENCY PERIOD.—The
 9 term "COVID-19 emergency period" means the pe-

riod beginning March 15, 2020, and ending on the
 later of—

- (A) June 30, 2021; or 3 4 (B) the date of expiration of the public 5 health emergency declared by the Secretary of 6 Health and Human Services under section 319 7 of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 8 247d) on January 31, 2020, with respect to 9 COVID-19. 10 (2) DIGITAL MARKETPLACE COMPANY.—The 11 term "digital marketplace company" means a busi-12 ness entity affecting commerce that— 13 (A) maintains an online-enabled applica-14 tion or platform to facilitate the exchange of 15 goods or services by users of the online-enabled 16 application or platform; 17 (B) licenses access to an online-enabled ap-18 plication or platform to facilitate the exchange
- 19 of goods or services; and

20 (C) does not require a licensee using the
21 online-enabled application or platform to gen22 erate business to accept any specific job request
23 as a condition of maintaining access to the enti24 ty's online-enabled application or platform.

(3) INDIVIDUAL ACCESSING WORK THROUGH A
 DIGITAL MARKETPLACE COMPANY.—The term "indi vidual accessing work through a digital marketplace
 company" means an individual who—
 (A) is provided with the option to accept or

6 reject job requests through an online-enabled
7 application or platform maintained by a digital
8 marketplace company; and

9 (B) provides services to digital platform 10 consumers upon connection through a digital 11 network maintained by the digital marketplace 12 company in exchange for compensation or pay-13 ment of a fee.

14 (b) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-15 sion of law, in order to promote the general health and well-being of individuals accessing work through digital 16 17 marketplace companies and to facilitate financial assist-18 ance during public health emergencies, actions described in subsection (c) taken by a digital marketplace company 19 20 during the COVID-19 emergency period shall not be used 21 under any Federal, State, or local law, ordinance, or regu-22 lation as evidence for the purposes of—

(1) determining whether an individual accessing
work through the digital marketplace company is an
employee or independent contractor; or

1	(2) determining whether the digital marketplace
2	company is the joint employer of an individual who
3	is providing services on behalf of another company.
4	(c) PROTECTED ACTIONS.—The actions described in
5	this subsection are—
6	(1) providing financial assistance to individuals
7	who previously accessed work through the digital
8	marketplace company but are unable to work be-
9	cause of health or safety concerns;
10	(2) directly providing benefits that are related
11	to the health or safety of individuals accessing work
12	through the digital marketplace company;
13	(3) providing training or information related to
14	the health or safety of such individuals or the public;
15	(4) providing medical or cleaning supplies to
16	such individuals;
17	(5) performing health checks on such individ-
18	uals;
19	(6) providing medical testing to such individ-
20	uals; and
21	(7) taking any action, including those required
22	or suggested by any Federal, State, or local law, or-
23	dinance, order, or directive of any type, that is in-
24	tended to protect public health and safety.
