A BILL

To authorize assistance for fair housing enforcement activities to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fair Housing Enforce-
- 5 ment Emergency Act of 2021".
- 6 SEC. 2. FAIR HOUSING ACTIVITIES.
- 7 (a) Definition of COVID-19 Emergency Pe-
- 8 RIOD.—For purposes of this section, the term "COVID-

- 19 emergency period" means the period that begins upon
- the date of the enactment of this Act and ends upon the
- 3 date of the termination by the Federal Emergency Man-
- 4 agement Agency of the emergency declared on March 13,
- 2020, by the President under the Robert T. Stafford Dis-
- aster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C.
- 7 4121 et seq.) relating to the Coronavirus Disease 2019
- 8 (COVID-19) pandemic.

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9 (b) FHIP; FHAP.—

- 10 (1) APPROPRIATIONS.—Out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, there is 12 appropriated to ensure that fair housing organiza-13 tions and State and local civil rights agencies have 14 sufficient resources to deal with expected increases 15 in fair housing complaints, to investigate housing 16 discrimination, including financial scams that target 17 protected classes, associated with or resulting from 18 the COVID-19 pandemic, and during such pan-19 demic, for contracts, grants, and other assistance—
 - (A) \$39,740,000 for fiscal year 2021 for the Fair Housing Initiatives Program under section 561 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1987 (42 U.S.C. 3616a), of

1	(i) $\$8,740,000$ shall be available for
2	assistance under subsection (d) of such
3	section 561 for education and outreach ac-
4	tivities;
5	(ii) \$18,500,000 shall be available for
6	private enforcement initiatives under sub-
7	section (b) of such section 561;
8	(iii) \$2,500,000 shall be available for
9	an initiative to provide technical assistance
10	and training to such organizations and en-
11	tities regarding fair housing issues related
12	to the COVID-19 pandemic; and
13	(iv) \$10,000,000, which shall remain
14	available until September 30, 2024, shall
15	be available for the Office of Fair Housing
16	and Equal Opportunity of the Department
17	of Housing and Urban Development to
18	carry out a national media campaign to
19	educate the public of increased housing
20	rights during COVID-19 emergency period
21	that provides that information and mate-
22	rials used in such campaign are avail-
23	able—

1	(I) in the languages used by com-
2	munities with limited English pro-
3	ficiency; and
4	(II) to persons with disabilities.
5	(B) $\$35,000,000$ for fiscal year 2021 for
6	the Fair Housing Assistance Program under
7	the Fair Housing Act (42 U.S.C. 3601 et seq.).
8	(2) Use of telephone and internet capa-
9	BILITIES.—Amounts made available by paragraph
10	(1) may be used by such organizations and agencies
11	to establish the capacity to and to carry out activi-
12	ties and services by telephone and online means, in-
13	cluding for individuals with limited English pro-
14	ficiency and individuals with a disability in accord-
15	ance with requirements under the Americans With
16	Disabilities Act of 1990.
17	(3) Priority for private enforcement ini-
18	TIATIVES AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE.—In entering
19	into contracts for private enforcement initiatives
20	under 561(b) of the Housing and Community Devel-
21	opment Act of 1987 (42 U.S.C. 3616a(b)) using
22	amounts made available by paragraph (1)(A)(ii) of
23	this subsection and contracts for technical assistance
24	and training using amounts made available by para-

graph (1)(A)(iii), the Secretary of Housing and

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Urban Development shall give priority to applications from qualified fair housing enforcement organizations that have at least 2 years of fair housing testing experience.

(4) 3-YEAR GRANTS.—A grant for any grantee from any amounts made available by clause (i), (ii), or (iii) of paragraph (1)(A) shall be made for a 3-year period, subject to the request of the grantee, and the grantee shall receive an allocation of such grant amounts annually during such 3-year period.

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
