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1	AN ACT relating to the rural hospital operations and facilities revolving loan fund,
2	making an appropriation therefor, and declaring an emergency.
3	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
4	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF SUBCHAPTER 20 OF KRS CHAPTER
5	154 IS CREATED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:
6	(1) As used in this section:
7	(a) "Authority" means the Kentucky Economic Development Finance
8	Authority; and
9	(b) "Rural hospital" means any hospital located within a county of the
10	Commonwealth having a population of less than fifty thousand (50,000)
11	according to the most recent annual estimates of the resident population
12	issued by the United States Census Bureau.
13	(2) (a) The rural hospital operations and facilities revolving loan fund is
14	established for the authority to provide loans to a rural hospital.
15	(b) Any loan issued by the authority shall not exceed a twenty (20) year term
16	and shall be utilized by the Cabinet for Economic Development to assist a
17	rural hospital in providing needed direct health care services for the citizens
18	of the Commonwealth by:
19	1. Maintaining or upgrading the hospital's facilities;
20	2. Maintaining or increasing the current staff of the rural hospital; or
21	3. Providing health care services that are not currently available to
22	<u>citizens.</u>
23	(3) The Cabinet for Economic Development shall:
24	(a) Determine the terms and conditions of each loan, including the repayment
25	to be deposited back in the revolving loan fund for issuance of future loans
26	to other rural hospitals;
27	(b) Monitor the performance of the rural hospital: and

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1	(c) By October 1, 2020, and by each October 1 thereafter, report to the	<u>Interim</u>
2	Joint Committee on Appropriations and Revenue information abo	ut each
3	outstanding loan issued, including:	
4	1. The name and location of the rural hospital;	
5	2. The amount of principal originally loaned;	
6	3. The terms of the loan and whether the rural hospital is ca	urrently
7	meeting those terms; and	
8	4. How the rural hospital used the loan related to facilities, s	taff, or
9	additional services.	
10	(4) (a) The fund created in subsection (2) of this section shall be a trust and	agency
11	account.	
12	(b) The Cabinet for Economic Development shall administer the fund.	
13	(c) The fund shall consist of appropriations, contributions, donations,	gifts, or
14	<u>federal funds.</u>	
15	(d) Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, any moneys remaining in the fund	l at the
16	close of the fiscal year shall not lapse but shall be carried forward	into the
17	succeeding fiscal year.	
18	(e) Any interest earnings of the fund shall become a part of the fund as	nd shall
19	not lapse.	
20	(f) Moneys deposited in the fund are hereby appropriated for the sole	<u>purpose</u>
21	of providing loans to rural hospitals.	
22	→ Section 2. Notwithstanding 2020 Regular Session HB 352/EN, Part	i III, 2.,
23	unbudgeted Restricted Funds may be allotted and expended for the purchase of J	personal

27	→ Section 3. Whereas rural hospitals provide medical services that are ess	ential to

- 2 takes effect upon its passage and approval by the Governor or upon its otherwise
