## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Reaffirming the House of Representatives' commitment to strengthening military
- 2 installations located within this state; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the support of our nation's defenses and the members of our armed forces
- 4 remains a commitment and priority of the House of Representatives; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Georgia has the nation's 5th largest military population, and the military
- 6 accounts for some \$20 billion of economic impact annually in this state; and
- 7 WHEREAS, the Department of Defense directly employs almost 150,000 Georgians, and
- 8 Department of Defense activities are indirectly responsible for an estimated 330,000
- 9 additional jobs; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Georgia is home to some 750,000 veterans, which makes our state the 8th
- 11 largest in terms of veteran population in the nation; and
- 12 WHEREAS, through various laws and regulations, including, but not limited to, Base
- 13 Realignment & Closure (BRAC), reductions-in-force, and budgetary constraints, any of
- 14 Georgia's military bases may face downsizing or closure; and
- 15 WHEREAS, in anticipation of future BRAC proceedings, the House of Representatives did
- establish a Military Affairs Study Committee by adopting House Resolution 1135 in the 2016
- 17 legislative session; and
- 18 WHEREAS, that Military Affairs Study Committee did meet at military installations
- 19 throughout the state in the fall and winter of 2016, hearing hours of testimony from military
- 20 leaders, members of Congress, local government officials, and community organizations; and

21 WHEREAS, that Military Affairs Study Committee issued a report in December 2016 that

- 22 included a number of recommendations pertaining to policy areas, including education, local
- 23 planning, economic development, and infrastructure; and
- 24 WHEREAS, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, under authority of the Rules of the
- 25 House of Representatives, did create the Military Affairs Working Group which will
- 26 continue the work of recommending legislation or other legislative action to support our
- 27 military installations and those who serve on them during the 2017-2018 legislative session.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 29 (1) That the House reaffirms its commitment to strengthening the military installations
- located within this state to, in part, maximize the military value of those installations;
- 31 (2) That the House rededicates itself to supporting our troops and their families, taking
- 32 all actions which it shall deem prudent to improve their quality of life and otherwise
- empower them to contribute to our nation's defenses;
- 34 (3) That the House expresses its sincere desire that the State of Georgia remain integral
- 35 to our armed forces and the continued success of their mission as well as remain a valued
- partner for the United States Department of Defense; and
- 37 (4) That the Speaker of the House and his designee or designees be authorized and
- encouraged to convey these sentiments to all relevant parties and otherwise engage in
- 39 proceedings to achieve these ends.
- 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 41 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 42 members of Georgia's congressional delegation, the Secretary of Defense of the United
- 43 States, and the commanding officers of each of the military installations located within the
- 44 State of Georgia.
