## **S. 1091**

### AN ACT

To establish a Federal Task Force to Support Grandparents Raising Grandchildren.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Supporting Grand-3 parents Raising Grandchildren Act".

#### 4 SEC. 2. FEDERAL TASK FORCE TO SUPPORT GRAND-5 PARENTS RAISING GRANDCHILDREN.

6 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established a Fed7 eral Task Force to Support Grandparents Raising Grand8 children (referred to in this section as the "Task Force").
9 (b) OLDER RELATIVE CAREGIVER.—In this section,
10 the term "older relative caregiver" has the meaning given

11 the term under section 372(a)(3) of the National Family
12 Caregiver Support (42 U.S.C. 3030s(a)(3)).

- 13 (c) MEMBERSHIP.—
- 14 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Task Force shall be
  15 composed of the following members, or their des16 ignee:
- 17 (A) The Secretary of Health and Human18 Services.
- 19 (B) The Attorney General.
- 20 (C) The Administrator of the Administra21 tion for Community Living.
  22 (D) The Director of the Centers for Dis-
- 23 ease Control and Prevention.
- 24 (E) The Assistant Secretary for Mental25 Health and Substance Use.

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1	(F) The Assistant Secretary for the Ad-
2	ministration for Children and Families.
3	(G) The Director of the Indian Health
4	Service.
5	(H) The Administrator of the Centers for
6	Medicare & Medicaid Services.
7	(I) The head of each Federal department,
8	agency, or other governmental entity identified
9	by the Secretary of Health and Human Services
10	as having responsibilities, or administering pro-
11	grams, relating to the current health, edu-
12	cational, nutritional, and other needs and cur-
13	rent issues affecting older relative caregivers,
14	including grandparents, raising children in their
15	care.
16	(J) A grandparent raising a grandchild or
17	grandchildren as well as another older relative
18	caregiver of children.
19	(2) LEAD AGENCY.—The Department of Health
20	and Human Services shall be the lead agency for the
21	Task Force.
22	(d) DUTIES.—
23	(1) IN GENERAL.—
24	(A) INFORMATION.—The Task Force shall
25	identify, coordinate, and disseminate informa-

1 tion publicly about Federal information, re-2 sources, and best practices available, on the 3 date of the determination, to help older relative 4 caregivers, including grandparents, raising chil-5 dren in their care, including those raising chil-6 dren in their care as a result of the opioid cri-7 sis, meet the health, educational, nutritional, 8 and other needs of the children in their care as 9 well as maintain their own physical and mental 10 health and emotional well-being.

(B) NATIVE AMERICANS.—In carrying out
the duties described in subparagraph (A), the
Task Force shall ensure that the needs of Native Americans (as defined in section 102 of the
Older Americans Act of 1965 (42 U.S.C.
3002)) are considered.

17 (2) Report.—

18 (A) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 360 19 days after the date of enactment of this Act, 20 the Task Force shall submit a report to the 21 Special Committee on Aging, the Committee on 22 Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions, and 23 the Committee on Finance of the Senate and 24 the Committee on Education and the Work-25 force, the Committee on Energy and Commerce,

1	and the Committee on Ways and Means of the
2	House of Representatives that includes—
3	(i) best practices, resources, and other
4	useful information for older relative care-
5	givers, including grandparents, raising chil-
6	dren in their care; and
7	(ii) an identification of the gaps in
8	needs of older relative caregivers, including
9	grandparents, raising children in their
10	care.
11	(B) FINAL REPORT.—Not later than 4
12	years after the date of enactment of this Act,
13	the Task Force shall submit a final report to
14	the Special Committee on Aging, the Committee
15	on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions,
16	and the Committee on Finance of the Senate
17	and the Committee on Education and the
18	Workforce, the Committee on Energy and Com-
19	merce, and the Committee on Ways and Means
20	of the House of Representatives that includes
21	the final findings of the Task Force, rec-
22	ommendations for future actions to address
23	issues faced by older relative caregivers, includ-
24	ing grandparents, raising children in their care,
25	and any other useful information.

1 (3) PROCESS FOR PUBLIC INPUT.—The Task 2 Force shall establish a process for public input to in-3 form the identification of, and updates to, the best 4 practices, resources, and other useful information 5 and the gaps in needs described in paragraph (2), 6 including a process for the public to submit rec-7 ommendations to the Task Force and an opportunity 8 for public comment.

9 (e) SUNSET.—The Task Force shall terminate on the
10 date that is 5 years after the date of enactment of this
11 Act.

(f) NONAPPLICABILITY OF FACA.—The Federal Advisory Committee Act (5 U.S.C. App.) shall not apply to
the Task Force.

(g) FUNDING.—No additional funds are authorized
to be appropriated to carry out this section. The Task
Force shall be carried out with funds otherwise appropriated.
