## JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to limit the number of consecutive terms that a Member of Congress may serve.

1       *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*  
2       *of the United States of America in Congress assembled*  
3       *(two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-*  
4       *lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-*  
5       *stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all*  
6       *intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when*  
7       *ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several*  
8       *States within seven years after the date of its submission*  
9       *for ratification:*

1 “ARTICLE —

2 “SECTION 1. No person who has been a Senator for  
3 two consecutive terms shall again be eligible for election  
4 or appointment to the Senate until the date that is one  
5 year after the end of such second consecutive term.

6 “SECTION 2. No person who has been a Representa-  
7 tive for six consecutive terms shall again be eligible for  
8 election to the House of Representatives until the date  
9 that is one year after the end of the sixth consecutive  
10 term.

11 “SECTION 3. For purposes of this article, any term  
12 a person serves as a Senator or Representative to fill a  
13 vacancy shall not be included in determining the number  
14 of consecutive terms that the person has been a Senator  
15 or Representative unless the period of time for which the  
16 person fills the vacancy is greater than three years in the  
17 case of a Senator or greater than one year in the case  
18 of a Representative.

19 “SECTION 4. For the purposes of this article, any  
20 term that began before the date of the ratification of this  
21 article shall not be included in determining the number  
22 of consecutive terms that a person has been a Senator or  
23 Representative.”.
