A BILL

To require the Secretary of Health and Human Services to develop a voluntary registry to collect data on cancer incidence among firefighters. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Firefighter Cancer
5 Registry Act of 2017".

6 SEC. 2. PATIENT REGISTRY FOR FIREFIGHTER CANCER IN 7 CIDENCE.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Health and 9 Human Services, acting through the Director of the Cen-10 ters for Disease Control and Prevention, shall develop and 11 maintain, directly or through a grant or cooperative agreement, a voluntary registry of firefighters (referred to in 12 this section as the "Firefighter Registry") to collect rel-13 evant history and occupational information of such fire-14 15 fighters that can be linked to available cancer registry data collected by existing State cancer registries. 16

17 (b) USE OF FIREFIGHTER REGISTRY.—The Fire18 fighter Registry shall be used for the following purposes:

19 (1) To establish and improve collection infra20 structure and activities related to the nationwide
21 monitoring of the incidence of cancer among fire22 fighters.

23 (2) To collect, consolidate, store, and make
 24 publicly available epidemiological information related
 25 to cancer incidence and trends among firefighters.

1 (c) Relevant Data.—

2	(1) IN GENERAL.—In carrying out the vol-
3	untary data collection for purposes of inclusion
4	under the Firefighter Registry, the Secretary should
5	seek to include the following information:
6	(A) Identifiable information from a rep-
7	resentative sample size, as determined by the
8	Secretary under subsection $(d)(2)(A)$, of volun-
9	teer, paid-on-call, and career firefighters, inde-
10	pendent of cancer status or diagnosis.
11	(B) With respect to individual risk factors
12	and work history of firefighters, available infor-
13	mation on—
14	(i) basic demographic information, in-
15	eluding the age of the firefighter involved;
16	(ii) a listing of status of the fire-
16 17	(ii) a listing of status of the fire- fighter as either volunteer, paid-on-call, or
17	fighter as either volunteer, paid-on-call, or
17 18	fighter as either volunteer, paid-on-call, or career firefighter;
17 18 19	fighter as either volunteer, paid-on-call, or career firefighter; (iii) the number of years on the job

4	unable to provide information on such

6	number and type based on the method de-
7	veloped under subsection $(d)(2)$;
8	(v) a list of additional risk factors, in-
9	cluding smoking or drug use, as deter-
10	mined relevant by the Secretary; and
11	(vi) Other physical examination and
12	medical history information relevant to a
13	cancer incidence study or general health of
14	firefighters not available in existing cancer
15	registrics.
16	(C) Any additional information that is
17	deemed necessary by the Secretary.
18	(2) Diagnoses and treatment.—In carrying
19	out the data collection for purposes of inclusion
20	under the Firefighter Registry, with respect to diag-
21	noses and treatment of firefighters diagnosed with
22	cancer, the Secretary shall enable the Firefighter
23	Registry to link to State-based cancer registries, for
24	a purpose described by clause (vi) or (vii) of section

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1	399B(c)(2)(D) of the Public Health Service Act (42
2	U.S.C. 280e(c)(2)(D)), to obtain information on—
3	(A) administrative information, including
4	date of diagnoses and source of information;
5	and
6	(B) pathological data characterizing the
7	cancer, including cancer site, state of disease
8	(pursuant to Staging Guide), incidence, and
9	type of treatment.
10	(d) Methods.—
11	(1) In GENERAL.—For the purposes described
12	in subsection (b), the Secretary is authorized to in-
13	corporate questions into public health surveys, ques-
14	tionnaires, and other databases.
15	(2) Required strategy.—The Secretary shall
16	develop a strategy, working in consultation with the
17	stakeholders identified in subsection (e), to maximize
18	participation in the Firefighter Registry established
19	under this Act. At minimum, the strategy shall in-
20	elude the following:
21	(A) Identified minimum participation tar-
22	gets for volunteer, paid-on-call, and career fire-
23	fighters.
24	(B) A strategy for increasing awareness of
25	the Firefighter Registry and maximizing par-

1	ticipation among volunteer, paid-on-call, and ca-
2	reer firefighters to meet minimum participation
3	targets.
4	(C) Additional steps that may be required
5	to ensure the equitable representation of groups
6	identified in paragraph (5).
7	(D) Information on how the Secretary will
8	store data described in subsection $(e)(1)$ and
9	provide links to relevant health information de-
10	scribed in subsection $(c)(2)$.
11	(E) Working in consultation with the ex-
12	perts described in subsection (e), a reliable and
13	standardized method for estimating the number
14	of fire incidents attended by a firefighter as
15	well as the type of fire incident so attended in
16	the case such firefighter is unable to provide
17	such information.
18	(3) Report to congress.—The Secretary
19	shall submit the strategy described in paragraph (2)
20	to the Committee on Energy and Commerce of the
21	House of Representatives and the Committee on
22	Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions of the Sen-
23	ate not later than 30 days after the date of the com-
24	pletion of the strategy.

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1	(4) GUIDANCE FOR INCLUSION AND MAINTE-
2	NANCE OF DATA ON FIREFIGHTERS.—The Secretary
3	shall develop, in consultation with the stakeholders
4	identified in subsection (e), and disseminate guid-
5	ance to State health agencies, State departments of
6	homeland security, and volunteer, paid-on-call, com-
7	bination, and career firefighting agencies that out-
8	lines the following:
9	(Λ) How new information about fire-
10	fighters will be submitted to the Firefighter
11	Registry for inclusion.
12	(B) How information about firefighters will
13	be maintained and updated in the Firefighter
14	Registry over time.
15	(C) A method for estimating the number of
16	fire incidents attended by a firefighter as well
17	as the type of fire incident so attended in the
18	case such firefighter is unable to provide such
19	information.
20	(D) Further information, as deemed nee-
21	essary by the Secretary.
22	(5) Ensuring representation of under-
23	REPRESENTED GROUPS IN REGISTRYIn carrying
24	out this section, the Secretary shall take such meas-
25	ures as the Secretary deems appropriate to encour-

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1	age the inclusion of data on minority, female, and
2	volunteer firefighters in the Firefighter Registry es-
3	tablished under this section.
4	(e) Consultation.—The Secretary shall, on a reg-
5	ular basis, seek feedback regarding the utility of the Fire-
6	fighter Registry established under this section and ways
7	the Firefighter Registry can be improved from non-Fed-
8	eral experts in the following areas:
9	(1) Public health experts with experience in de-
10	veloping and maintaining cancer registries.
11	(2) Epidemiologists with experience in studying
12	cancer incidence.
13	(3) Clinicians with experience in diagnosing and
14	treating cancer incidence.
15	(4) Active and retired volunteer, paid-on-call,
16	and career firefighters as well as relevant national
17	fire and emergency response organizations.
18	(f) Research Availability.—The Secretary shall
19	develop and make public a process for de-identifying data
20	from the Firefighter Registry and making such data avail-
21	able without a fee for research or other purposes. Such
22	process shall provide that such data shall be made avail-
23	able for such research purposes only if there is an agree-
24	ment to make findings, journal articles, or other print or
25	web-based publications derived from such research public

or available to the relevant stakeholders identified in sub section (e).

3 (g) PRIVACY.—In carrying out this Act, the Secretary 4 shall apply to the Firefighter Registry developed under 5 subsection (a) data security provisions and privacy standards that comply with the best practices of the Centers 6 7 for Disease Control and Prevention and provide for data 8 privacy and security standards similar to those in the 9 HIPAA privacy regulation, as defined in section 1180(b)(3) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1320d-10 11 9(b)(3)).

12 (h) AUTHORIZATION OF FUNDS. To carry out this 13 section, there are authorized to be appropriated 14 \$2,500,000 for each of the fiscal years 2018 through 15 2022.

16 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

17 This Act may be cited as the "Firefighter Cancer Reg-18 istry Act of 2018".

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Health and
Human Services (referred to in this section as the "Secretary"), acting through the Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and in coordination with other
agencies as the Secretary determines appropriate, shall de-

velop and maintain, directly or through a grant or coopera tive agreement, a voluntary registry of firefighters (referred
 to in this section as the "Firefighter Registry") to collect
 relevant health and occupational information of such fire fighters for purposes of determining cancer incidence.

6 (b) USE OF FIREFIGHTER REGISTRY.—The Firefighter
7 Registry may be used for the following purposes:

8 (1) To improve data collection and data coordi9 nation activities related to the nationwide monitoring
10 of the incidence of cancer among firefighters.

11 (2) To collect, consolidate, and maintain, con12 sistent with subsection (g), epidemiological informa13 tion and analyses related to cancer incidence and
14 trends among firefighters

15 (c) RELEVANT DATA.—

16 (1) DATA COLLECTION.—In carrying out the vol17 untary data collection for purposes of inclusion under
18 the Firefighter Registry, the Secretary may collect the
19 following:

20 (A) Information, as determined by the Sec21 retary under subsection (d)(1), of volunteer,
22 paid-on-call, and career firefighters, independent
23 of cancer status or diagnosis.

24 (B) Individual risk factors and occupa25 tional history of firefighters.

(C) Information, if available, related to— 1 2 (i) basic demographic information, including— 3 4 (I) the age of the firefighter in-5 volved during the relevant dates of oc-6 cupation as a firefighter; and 7 (II) the age of cancer diagnosis; 8 (ii) the status of the firefighter as ei-9 ther volunteer, paid-on-call, or career fire-10 fighter; 11 (iii) the total number of years of occu-12 pation as a firefighter and a detailing of 13 additional employment experience, whether 14 concurrent, before, or anytime thereafter: 15 (iv)(I) the approximate number of fire incidents attended, including information 16 17 related to the type of fire incidents and the 18 role of the firefighter in responding to the 19 incident; or 20 (II) in the case of a firefighter for 21 whom information on such number and 22 type is unavailable, an estimate of such 23 number and type based on the method developed under subsection (d)(1)(D); and 24

1	(a) other modical information and
	(v) other medical information and
2	health history, including additional risk
3	factors, as appropriate, and other informa-
4	tion relevant to a cancer incidence study of
5	firefighters.
6	(2) INFORMATION ON DIAGNOSES AND TREAT-
7	MENT.—In carrying out paragraph (1), with respect
8	to diagnoses and treatment of firefighters with cancer,
9	the Secretary shall, as appropriate, enable the Fire-
10	fighter Registry to electronically connect to State-
11	based cancer registries, for a purpose described by
12	clause (vi) or (vii) of section $399B(c)(2)(D)$ of the
13	Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. $280e(c)(2)(D)$),
14	to obtain—
15	(A) date of diagnoses and source of informa-
16	tion; and
17	(B) pathological data characterizing the
18	cancer, including cancer site, state of disease
19	(pursuant to Staging Guide), incidence, and
20	type of treatment.
21	(d) Firefighter Registry Coordination Strat-
22	EGY.—
23	(1) REQUIRED STRATEGY.—The Secretary shall,
24	in consultation with the relevant stakeholders, such as
25	medical professionals and public health experts with

1	experience developing and maintaining cancer reg-
2	istries, studying cancer incidence, or diagnosing and
3	treating cancer, including epidemiologists and pa-
4	thologists, develop a strategy to coordinate data collec-
5	tion activities, including within existing State reg-
6	istries, for inclusion in the Firefighter Registry estab-
7	lished under this Act. The strategy may include the
8	following:
9	(A) Increasing awareness of the Firefighter
10	Registry and encouraging participation among
11	volunteer, paid-on-call, and career firefighters.
12	(B) Consideration of unique data collection
13	needs that may arise to generate a statistically
14	reliable representation of minority, female, and
15	volunteer firefighters, including methods, as
16	needed, to encourage participation from such
17	populations.
18	(C) Information on how the Secretary will
19	store data described in subsection $(c)(1)$ and pro-
20	vide electronic access to relevant health informa-
21	tion described in subsection $(c)(2)$.
22	(D) Working in consultation with the ex-
23	perts described in subsection (e), a reliable and
24	standardized method for estimating the number
25	of fire incidents attended by a firefighter as well

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as the type of fire incident so attended in the 2 case such firefighter is unable to provide such in-3 formation.

4 (2) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—The Secretary shall 5 submit the strategy described in paragraph (1) to the 6 Committee on Energy and Commerce of the House of 7 Representatives and the Committee on Health. Edu-8 cation, Labor, and Pensions of the Senate not later 9 than 30 days after the date of the completion of the 10 strategy.

11 (3) Guidance for inclusion and mainte-12 NANCE OF DATA ON FIREFIGHTERS.—The Secretary 13 shall develop, in consultation with the stakeholders 14 identified in subsection (e), State health agencies, 15 State departments of homeland security, and volun-16 teer, paid-on-call, combination, and career fire-17 fighting agencies, a strategy for inclusion of fire-18 fighters in the registry that are representative of the 19 general population of firefighters, that outlines the fol-20 lowing:

21 (A) How new information about firefighters 22 will be submitted to the Firefighter Registry for 23 inclusion.

1	(B) How information about firefighters will
2	be maintained and updated in the Firefighter
3	Registry over time.
4	(C) A method for estimating the number of
5	fire incidents attended by a firefighter as well as
6	the type of fire incident so attended in the case
7	such firefighter is unable to provide such infor-
8	mation.
9	(D) Further information, as deemed nec-
10	essary by the Secretary.
11	(e) CONSULTATION AND REPORT.—The Secretary shall
12	consult with non-Federal experts on the Firefighter Registry
13	established under this section, and shall submit to the Com-
14	mittee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions of the
15	Senate and the Committee on Energy and Commerce of the
16	House of Representatives a report that includes, as appro-
17	priate, information on goals achieved and improvements
18	needed to strengthen the Firefighter Registry. Such non-
19	Federal experts shall include the following:
20	(1) Public health experts with experience in de-
21	veloping and maintaining cancer registries.
22	(2) Epidemiologists with experience in studying
23	cancer incidence.
24	(3) Clinicians with experience in diagnosing and
25	treating cancer incidence.

(4) Active and retired volunteer, paid-on-call,
 and career firefighters as well as relevant national
 fire and emergency response organizations.

4 (f) RESEARCH AVAILABILITY.—Subject to subsection 5 (g), the Secretary shall ensure that information and anal-6 ysis in the Firefighter Registry are available, as appro-7 priate, to the public, including researchers and firefighters. 8 (g) PRIVACY.—In carrying out this Act, the Secretary 9 shall ensure that information in and analysis of the Firefighter Registry are made available in a manner that, at 10 a minimum, protects personal privacy to the extent re-11 12 quired by applicable Federal and State privacy law.

(h) AUTHORIZATION OF FUNDS.—To carry out this
section, there are authorized to be appropriated \$2,500,000
for each of the fiscal years 2018 through 2022.
