1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12	Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal, special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, primary and election expenses and election contests; creating and defining membership of county boards of elections; imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth, courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners; imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to elections," in preparation for and conduct of primaries and elections, providing for cargo securement.
13	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
14	hereby enacts as follows:
15	Section 1. The act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known
16	as the Pennsylvania Election Code, is amended by adding a
17	section to read:
18	Section 1234. Cargo Securement(a) Each county board
19	shall use a cargo securement procedure, in accordance with this
20	section, to ensure that ballots cast in an election are not
21	tampered with or counted erroneously.
22	(b) Ballots cast in an election shall be secured in a
23	transportation container with a numbered security tag that seals

1	the transportation container and includes an individually
2	<u>identifiable number.</u>
3	(c) The following apply to a bill of lading:
4	(1) The cargo securement procedures under this section shall
5	include a bill of lading sealed within each transportation
6	container described in subsection (b), which shall accompany the
7	ballots cast in the election:
8	(i) at the location that the ballots are initially
9	<pre>collected;</pre>
10	(ii) while the ballots are in transit; and
11	(iii) at any storage location for the ballots.
12	(2) The bill of lading shall include the location, date and
13	time that the ballots cast in the election were collected, along
14	with the numbered security tag number.
15	(3) The bill of lading shall remain with the ballots cast in
16	the election, with or without the accompanying security
17	envelopes for the ballots, through the final ballot storage
18	location.
19	(d) If the numbered security tag is broken, the bill of
20	lading shall be marked with the:
21	(1) location, date and time regarding the incident;
22	(2) reason for the incident;
23	(3) broken numbered security tag number; and
24	(4) newly affixed numbered security tag number.
25	(e) If a ballot storage location is monitored by staff, the
26	staff shall record the location, date, time and numbered
27	security tag number regarding the ballots cast in the election.
28	(f) A poll watcher shall be entitled to know the numbered
29	security tag numbers and location of the stored ballots cast in
30	the election, which are waiting to be counted or stored after
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1 <u>counting.</u>

2 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
