12	SECT	TION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

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one representative of the American Civil Liberties Union of Maryland, 1 (6) $\mathbf{2}$ selected by the American Civil Liberties Union of Maryland; 3 (7)one representative of the National Juvenile Defender Center, selected by the National Juvenile Defender Center; and 4 $\mathbf{5}$ (8)the following members, appointed by the Governor: 6 two individuals who have spent substantial time in solitary (i) 7 confinement in the correctional system of the State; and 8 one psychiatrist with experience treating individuals who have (ii) spent time in solitary confinement in the correctional system of the State. 9 The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention shall designate the 10 (c)chair of the Task Force. 11 12 (d) The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention shall provide staff for the Task Force. 13A member of the Task Force: 14(e) may not receive compensation as a member of the Task Force; but 15(1)16 (2)is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State 17Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget. The Task Force shall: 18 (f) 19 (1)study the use of solitary confinement as a disciplinary tool, and what 20effect solitary confinement has on recidivism and reoffense; 21(2)collect and analyze data regarding the reasons people are given solitary 22confinement, the average duration an individual spends in solitary confinement, and demographic statistics regarding what individuals are given solitary confinement; and 2324(3)recommend alternate means of punishment to be used instead of 25solitary confinement and methods to reduce or eliminate the use of solitary confinement. 26On or before December 1, 2017, the Task Force shall report its findings and (g) 27recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State 28Government Article, the General Assembly. 29SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2017. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of June 30

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- 1 30, 2018, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
- 2 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
