WHEREAS, there are parties who are pursuing artificial human introduction of wolves

WHEREAS, the artificial introduction of Canadian wolves into Idaho and Wyoming

and the rapid expansion and growth of wolf populations outside of those introduction areas has

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28 resulted in significant harm to indigenous wildlife populations of shiras moose, elk, mule deer, 29 and other wildlife species, and harm to livestock producers; 30 WHEREAS, wolf populations grow and travel outside areas of artificial introduction: 31 WHEREAS, a forced introduction of wolves could cost taxpayer dollars, redirect 32 already limited wildlife management resources, and have a significant negative economic 33 impact to the state; and 34 WHEREAS, the Legislature has struck a balance concerning wolf management that 35 would be disturbed by a significant influx of wolves as a result of artificial introduction of 36 wolves in surrounding states: 37 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah, the 38 Governor concurring therein, opposes the artificial human introduction of wolves into the 39 Southern Rockies, specifically including Colorado and any area where the wolves will travel 40 into or within the state of Utah which will result in widespread regional impacts and harm in 41 the state of Utah. 42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature and Governor call upon the 43 President of the United States, the United States Department of the Interior, and Congress, to 44 block efforts to force wolves on the state of Utah to preserve the historical and conservation 45 values of Utah, its wildlife, its family ranchers, its economy, its outdoor heritage, and its 46 citizens. 47 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the President of 48 the United States, the Secretary of the United States Department of the Interior, and each 49 member of Utah's congressional delegation.
