4 FOR the purpose of requiring the ~~Secretary of Natural Resources to adopt regulations~~
5 ~~requiring that certain crab pots be equipped with ghost panels and establishing~~
6 ~~certain specifications for ghost panels used in crab pots;~~ Tidal Fisheries Advisory
7 Commission to study certain adverse impacts caused by lost and abandoned crab
8 pots, identify and assess certain practices and measures for mitigating the problems
9 associated with lost and abandoned crab pots, and make recommendations for
10 addressing problems associated with certain lost and abandoned crab pots; requiring
11 the Commission to report to the Secretary of Natural Resources on or before a certain
12 date; providing for the termination of this Act; defining a certain term; and generally
13 relating to requirements for lost and abandoned crab pots.

~~(a) The authority provided by this section is in addition to any other authority of the Secretary provided by law.~~

~~(b) (1) Subject to [paragraph (2)] PARAGRAPHS (2) AND (3) of this subsection, the Secretary, after consultation with the Tidal Fisheries Advisory Commission and the Sport Fisheries Advisory Commission, may adopt regulations to define and govern the use of:~~

~~(i) Recreational fishing gear; and~~

~~(ii) The following types of commercial fishing gear:~~

~~1. Fish pots;~~

~~2. Bank traps;~~

~~3. Fyke nets;~~

~~4. Hoop nets;~~

~~5. Finfish trotlines; and~~

~~6. Bowfishing gear.~~

~~(2) The Department shall consider relevant biological, ecological, and socioeconomic factors before adopting regulations under this subsection.~~

~~(3) (i) IN THIS PARAGRAPH, "GHOST PANEL" MEANS A PANEL OR ANY OTHER MECHANISM THAT IS DESIGNED TO ALLOW CRABS TO ESCAPE FROM A CRAB POT AFTER A PERIOD OF TIME IF THE CRAB POT HAS BEEN ABANDONED OR LOST.~~

~~(ii) THE SECRETARY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO:~~

~~1. REQUIRE ALL CRAB POTS TO BE EQUIPPED WITH GHOST PANELS; AND~~

~~2. ESTABLISH SPECIFICATIONS FOR GHOST PANELS USED IN CRAB POTS.~~

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.

That:

1 (a) The Tidal Fisheries Advisory Commission, established under § 4-204(a) of the
2 Natural Resources Article, shall:

3 (1) study, using relevant literature, adverse impacts to fish species and
4 aquatic habitat caused by lost and abandoned crab pots;

5 (2) identify and assess practices and measures that could be implemented
6 or adopted to mitigate the problems associated with lost and abandoned crab pots,
7 including:

8 (i) the feasibility and potential impacts of requiring all crab pots to
9 be equipped with ghost panels;

10 (ii) costs associated with each mitigating practice and measure
11 considered by the Commission; and

12 (iii) the optimal timing for implementing any mitigating practices or
13 measures recommended by the Commission; and

14 (3) make recommendations for addressing problems associated with lost
15 and abandoned crab pots in the State.

16 (b) On or before December 31, 2020, the Commission shall report its findings and
17 recommendations to the Secretary of Natural Resources.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect ~~July~~
19 June 1, 2020. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of
20 June 30, 2021, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be
21 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
