2 Fishing Gear - <u>Lost and Abandoned</u> Crab Pots - Ghost Panel Requirement 3 <u>Study</u>

FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Natural Resources to adopt regulations 4 requiring that certain crab pots be equipped with ghost panels and establishing 5 6 certain specifications for ghost panels used in erab pots; Tidal Fisheries Advisory 7 Commission to study certain adverse impacts caused by lost and abandoned crab 8 pots, identify and assess certain practices and measures for mitigating the problems 9 associated with lost and abandoned crab pots, and make recommendations for 10 addressing problems associated with certain lost and abandoned crab pots; requiring 11 the Commission to report to the Secretary of Natural Resources on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; defining a certain term; and generally 12 relating to requirements for lost and abandoned crab pots. 13

3 4	(1) study, using relevant literature, adverse impacts to fish species and aquatic habitat caused by lost and abandoned crab pots;
5 6 7	(2) identify and assess practices and measures that could be implemented or adopted to mitigate the problems associated with lost and abandoned crab pots, including:
8 9	(i) the feasibility and potential impacts of requiring all crab pots to be equipped with ghost panels;
