A BILL

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Restoring Enforcement
3 Standards to Track Opioids Responsively and Effectively
4 Act of 2019” or the “RESTORE Act of 2019”.

5 **SEC. 2. RESTORING DEA’S AUTHORITY TO CARRY OUT**
6 **NEEDED ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS TO COM-**
7 **BAT DRUG DIVERSION AND THE OPIOID EPI-**
8 **DEMIC.**

9 (a) REPEAL.—Public Law 114–145 (the Ensuring
10 Patient Access and Effective Drug Enforcement Act of
11 2016) is hereby repealed.

12 (b) RESTORATION OF PROVISIONS.—

13 (1) Effective as of the date of enactment of
14 Public Law 114–145, the provisions of section 304
15 of the Controlled Substances Act (21 U.S.C. 824)
16 that were amended by Public Law 114–145 are
17 hereby restored as if Public Law 114–145 had not
18 been enacted into law.

19 (2) Subsection (k) of section 303 of the Con-
20 trolled Substances Act (21 U.S.C. 823(k)), as added
21 by Public Law 114–145 and redesignated by Public
22 Law 115–83, is hereby repealed.

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
