A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Task Force to Study Privatization of the University of Maryland Medical System

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study Privatization of the University of $\mathbf{5}$ Maryland Medical System; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the 6 Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain 7 compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the 8 Task Force to study and make recommendations regarding certain matters; 9 requiring the Task Force to report interim and final reports to the Governor and the 10 General Assembly on or before certain dates; providing for the termination of this 11 Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Study Privatization of the University of Maryland Medical System. 12

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 14 That:

(a) There is a Task Force to Study the Privatization of the University of MarylandMedical System.

- 18 (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of19 the Senate;
- 20 (2) one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the 21 House;

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
1, 2020. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and 1 month and, at the end of
September 30, 2022, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly,
