A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapters 39A and 40 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to real estate appraisers and real estate brokers and salespersons, respectively, so as
- 3 to change certain provisions relating to disciplinary actions and sanctions permitted for
- 4 failure of such real estate professionals to provide notification of convictions of certain
- 5 offenses; to require notification of convictions within a certain time frame; to provide for
- 6 revocation of a real estate professional's license or classification under certain circumstances;
- 7 to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 **SECTION 1.**

10 Chapter 39A of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to real estate

appraisers, is amended by revising subsection (i) of Code Section 43-39A-14, relating to

conduct of applicants and grounds for refusal of classification, imposition of sanctions, and

"(i) Whenever any appraiser is convicted of any offense enumerated in subsection (b) of this Code section, such appraiser shall immediately notify the board of that conviction within ten days from the date of the conviction. Such appraiser's appraiser classification shall automatically may be revoked by the board 60 days after the conviction unless the appraiser makes has made a written request to the board for a hearing during that 60 day period. Following any such hearing requested pursuant to this subsection, the board in its discretion may impose upon that such appraiser any disciplinary action or sanction permitted by this chapter or impose no disciplinary action or sanction. If an appraiser fails to make a written request for a hearing during the 60 day period after the conviction, then the board, upon discovery of the conviction, shall have the option of revoking the appraiser's appraiser classification without the appraiser being entitled to a hearing or the board in its discretion may impose upon such appraiser any other disciplinary action or

sanction permitted by this chapter or impose no disciplinary action or sanction."

SECTION 2.

28 Chapter 40 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to real estate 29 brokers and salespersons, is amended by revising subsection (i) of Code Section 43-40-15, 30 relating to grant of licenses, grounds for suspension or revocation of license, other sanctions, 31 surrender or lapse, and conviction, as follows: 32 "(i) Whenever any licensee is convicted of any offense enumerated in subsection (b) of this 33 Code section, the such licensee shall immediately notify the commission of that conviction within ten days from the date of the conviction. The Such licensee's license shall 34 35 automatically may be revoked by the commission 60 days after the licensee's conviction 36 unless the licensee makes has made a written request to the commission for a hearing during that 60 day period. Following any such hearing requested pursuant to this 37 38 subsection, the commission in its discretion may impose upon that such licensee any 39 <u>disciplinary action or sanction permitted by this chapter or impose no disciplinary action</u> 40 or sanction. If a licensee fails to make a written request for a hearing during the 60 day 41 period after the conviction, then the commission, upon discovery of the conviction, shall 42 have the option of revoking the licensee's license without the licensee being entitled to a 43 hearing or the commission in its discretion may impose upon such licensee any other 44 disciplinary action or sanction permitted by this chapter or impose no disciplinary action
