### A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

### 2 Election Law – Polling Places at Continuing Care Retirement Communities

3 FOR the purpose of requiring local boards of elections to establish separate precincts at 4 certain continuing care retirement communities under certain circumstances to  $\mathbf{5}$ specifically serve the retirement communities; requiring continuing care retirement 6 community providers to provide certain facilities and services to the local board if a 7 polling place is established at the continuing care retirement community; defining a 8 certain term; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to the 9 establishment of precincts and polling places at continuing care retirement 10 communities.

# SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 (ii) designate the location for polling places in any election district,  $\mathbf{2}$ ward, or precinct in the county; and 3 (iii) combine or abolish precincts. 4 (2)Except as provided under subparagraph (iii) of this paragraph, a (i) local board shall establish a separate precinct on campus or within one-half mile of the  $\mathbf{5}$ campus to specifically serve a public or private institution of higher education if the local 6 7board determines that at least 500 students, faculty, and staff who attend or work at the 8 institution are registered voters in the precinct in which the institution is located. If, in accordance with subparagraph (i) of this paragraph, a 9 (ii) polling place is established at an institution of higher education that receives State funds, 10 that institution shall: 11 12provide without charge to the local board a facility for use 1. 13as a polling place that meets all applicable requirements under this article and as 14established by the State Board; and 15provide assistance to the local board in recruiting election 2. judges to staff the polling place. 1617A local board may not be required to establish a separate precinct (iii) as provided under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph if there is an established precinct 18 19within one-half mile of the public or private institution of higher education's campus that 20serves the voters who attend or work at the public or private institution of higher education. 21(3) IN THIS PARAGRAPH, "CONTINUING CARE RETIREMENT **(I)** 22COMMUNITY" MEANS A FACILITY IN WHICH A PROVIDER THAT HOLDS A CERTIFICATE 23OF REGISTRATION UNDER § 10-412 OR § 10-413 OF THE HUMAN SERVICES ARTICLE 24PROVIDES CARE TO AT LEAST 200 INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE AT LEAST 60 YEARS OLD AND NOT RELATED BY BLOOD OR MARRIAGE TO THE PROVIDER. 2526**(II)** A LOCAL BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH A SEPARATE PRECINCT 27IN A CONTINUING CARE RETIREMENT COMMUNITY SPECIFICALLY TO SERVE AT 28LEAST THE RESIDENTS OF THE RETIREMENT COMMUNITY IF THE CONTINUING CARE 29RETIREMENT COMMUNITY REQUESTS THAT A POLLING PLACE BE ESTABLISHED ON 30 THE COMMUNITY PREMISES. 31(III) IF, IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS 32PARAGRAPH, A POLLING PLACE IS ESTABLISHED AT A CONTINUING CARE 33 RETIREMENT COMMUNITY, THE CONTINUING CARE RETIREMENT COMMUNITY SHALL: 34

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11.PROVIDE WITHOUT CHARGE TO THE LOCAL BOARD A2FACILITY FOR USE AS A POLLING PLACE THAT MEETS ALL APPLICABLE3REQUIREMENTS UNDER THIS ARTICLE AND AS ESTABLISHED BY THE STATE BOARD;4AND

5 2. PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO THE LOCAL BOARD IN 6 RECRUITING ELECTION JUDGES FROM AMONG THE RESIDENTS OF THE CONTINUING 7 CARE RETIREMENT COMMUNITY TO STAFF THE POLLING PLACE.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 January 1, 2021.
