A BILL

To amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to provide for the distribution of additional residency positions to help combat the opioid crisis.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Opioid Workforce Act
5	of 2019".
6	SEC. 2. DISTRIBUTION OF ADDITIONAL RESIDENCY POSI-
7	TIONS TO HELP COMBAT OPIOID CRISIS.
8	(a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1886(h) of the Social Secu-
9	rity Act (42 U.S.C. 1395ww(h)) is amended—
10	(1) in paragraph $(4)(F)(i)$, by striking "para-
11	graphs (7) and (8)" and inserting "paragraphs (7),
12	(8), and (9)";
13	(2) in paragraph $(4)(H)(i)$, by striking "para-
14	graphs (7) and (8)" and inserting "paragraphs (7),
15	(8), and (9)";
16	(3) in paragraph (7)(E), by inserting "para-
17	graph (9)," after "paragraph (8),"; and
18	(4) by adding at the end the following new para-
19	graph:
20	"(9) DISTRIBUTION OF ADDITIONAL RESIDENCY
21	POSITIONS TO HELP COMBAT OPIOID CRISIS.—
22	"(A) Additional residency positions.—
23	During the period of fiscal years 2022 through
24	2026 (and succeeding fiscal years if the Sec-
25	retary determines that there are additional full-

1	time-equivalent residency positions available to
2	distribute under $subparagraph$ (D)), the Sec-
3	retary shall distribute additional full-time-equiv-
4	alent residency positions to increase the other-
5	wise applicable resident limit for each qualifying
6	hospital that submits a timely application under
7	this paragraph by such number as the Secretary
8	may approve, effective beginning July 1 of the
9	fiscal year of the increase. The aggregate number
10	of additional full-time-equivalent residency posi-
11	tions available for distribution under this para-
12	graph shall be equal to 500 in fiscal year 2022
13	and 500 over the period of fiscal years 2023
14	through 2026, distributed in accordance with the
15	succeeding subparagraphs of this paragraph.
16	"(B) DISTRIBUTION FOR FISCAL YEAR
17	2022.—
18	"(i) In general.—For fiscal year
19	2022, the positions available for distribu-
20	tion for such fiscal year (as described in
21	subparagraph (A)) may only be distributed
22	to hospitals that have established (as of the
23	date of the enactment of this paragraph)
24	approved programs in addiction medicine,

1 addiction psychiatry, or pain medicine, as 2 determined by the Secretary. "(ii) Considerations in distribu-3 4 TION.—The Secretary shall distribute additional residency positions under this sub-5 6 paragraph based on the demonstrated likeli-7 hood, as determined by the Secretary, of the 8 hospital filling such positions within the 9 first 4 training years (as specified by the 10 Secretary) after the increase would be effective. 11 *"(iii)* 12 REQUIREMENTS.—A hospital 13 that receives an increase in the otherwise 14 applicable resident limit under this sub-15 paragraph shall ensure, during the 5-year 16 period beginning after the date of such in-17 crease, that the hospital uses the positions 18 made available under this subparagraph for 19 a program described in clause (i) or a pro-20 gram that is a prerequisite (as determined 21 by the Secretary) for such a program so de-22 scribed, such as internal medicine. The Sec-23 retary may determine whether a hospital

has met the requirements under this clause

"(iv) Redistribution of positions 4 5 IF HOSPITAL NO LONGER MEETS CERTAIN 6 REQUIREMENTS.—In the case in which the 7 Secretary determines that a hospital de-8 scribed in clause (iii) does not meet the re-9 quirements of such clause, the Secretary 10 shall— 11 "(I) reduce the otherwise applica-12 ble resident limit of the hospital by the 13 amount by which such limit was in-14 creased under this subparagraph; and 15 "(II) provide for the distribution 16 of positions attributable to such reduc-17 tion in accordance with the require-18 ments of this paragraph. 19 "(v) Positions Not distributed DURING FISCAL YEAR 2022.—If the number 20 21 of full-time-equivalent residency positions 22 distributed under this subparagraph is less 23 than the aggregate number of positions 24 available for distribution for fiscal year 25 2022 (as described in subparagraph (A)),

1	the difference between such number distrib-
2	uted and such number available for dis-
3	tribution shall be added to the aggregate
4	number of positions available for distribu-
5	tion under subparagraph (C).
6	"(C) Distribution for fiscal years 2023
7	<i>THROUGH 2026.</i> —
8	"(i) In general.—For the period of
9	fiscal years 2023 through 2026, the posi-
10	tions available for distribution for such pe-
11	riod (as described in subparagraph (A)),
12	and any positions made available pursuant
13	to subparagraph $(B)(v)$, shall be distributed
14	to hospitals which demonstrate to the Sec-
15	retary that the hospital has established or
16	will establish an approved residency train-
17	ing program in addiction medicine, addic-
18	tion psychiatry, or pain medicine.
19	"(ii) Considerations in distribu-
20	TION.—The Secretary shall distribute addi-
21	tional residency positions under this sub-
22	paragraph based on the demonstrated likeli-
23	hood, as determined by the Secretary, of the
24	hospital filling such positions within the
25	first 4 training years (as specified by the

Secretary) after the increase would be effective.

"(iii) REQUIREMENTS.—A 3 hospital 4 that receives an increase in the otherwise 5 applicable resident limit under this sub-6 paragraph shall ensure, during the 5-year 7 period beginning after the date of such in-8 crease, that the hospital uses the positions 9 made available under this subparagraph for 10 a program described in clause (i) or a pro-11 gram that is a prerequisite (as determined 12 by the Secretary) for such a program so de-13 scribed, such as internal medicine. The Sec-14 retary may determine whether a hospital 15 has met the requirements under this clause 16 during such 5-year period in such manner 17 and at such time as the Secretary deter-18 mines appropriate, including at the end of 19 such 5-year period. 20 "(iv) Redistribution of positions

20(iii) HEDISTRIBUTION OF TOSTHONS21IF HOSPITAL NO LONGER MEETS CERTAIN22REQUIREMENTS.—In the case where the Sec-23retary determines that a hospital described24in clause (iii) does not meet the require-25ments of such clause, the Secretary shall—

9	"(D) DISTRIBUTION OF REMAINING POSI-
10	TIONS.—If the aggregate number of positions dis-
11	tributed under subparagraphs (B) and (C) dur-
12	ing the period of fiscal years 2022 through 2026
13	is less than 1000, the Secretary shall distribute
14	the remaining residency positions in succeeding
15	fiscal years according to criteria consistent with
16	this paragraph until such time as the aggregate
17	amount of positions distributed under this para-
18	graph is equal to 1000.
19	"(E) LIMITATION.—An individual hospital
20	may not receive more than 25 full-time-equiva-
21	lent residency positions under this paragraph.
22	"(F) NOTIFICATION.—The Secretary shall
23	notify hospitals of the number of positions dis-
24	tributed to the hospital under this paragraph as
25	a result of an increase in the otherwise applica-

ble resident limit by January 1 of the fiscal year of the increase. Such increase shall be effective beginning July 1 of that fiscal year.

4 (G)APPLICATION OF PER RESIDENT 5 AMOUNTS FOR PRIMARY CARE AND NONPRIMARY 6 CARE.—With respect to additional residency po-7 sitions in a hospital attributable to the increase 8 provided under this paragraph, the approved 9 FTE per resident amounts are deemed to be 10 equal to the hospital per resident amounts for 11 primary care and nonprimary care computed 12 under paragraph (2)(D) for that hospital.

13 "(H) PERMITTING FACILITIES TO APPLY AG-14 GREGATION RULES.—The Secretary shall permit 15 hospitals receiving additional residency positions 16 attributable to the increase provided under this 17 paragraph to, beginning in the fifth year after 18 the effective date of such increase, apply such po-19 sitions to the limitation amount under para-20 graph (4)(F) that may be aggregated pursuant to 21 paragraph (4)(H) among members of the same 22 affiliated group.

23 "(I) CLARIFICATION.—Chapter 35 of title
24 44, United States Code, shall not apply to the
25 implementation of this paragraph.
