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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Blueprint for Maryland’s Future Implementation – Funding and Independent**  
3 **Evaluation – Alterations**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring, for certain fiscal years, each county board of education to  
5 provide for the salary and benefits of the Blueprint for Maryland’s Future  
6 implementation coordinator in the county; requiring the funding for the salary and  
7 benefits of the implementation coordinator to be paid for by the State and the county  
8 in a certain proportion; altering the dates by which the entity contracted by the  
9 Accountability and Implementation Board to perform an independent evaluation of  
10 the implementation of the Blueprint for Maryland’s Future is required to report to  
11 the Board and the Board is required to report to the Governor and the General  
12 Assembly; altering certain funding requirements under certain circumstances; and  
13 generally relating to the implementation of the Blueprint for Maryland’s Future.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article – Education**

4 5–404.

5 (b) (2) State and local government units responsible for implementing an  
6 element of the Blueprint for Maryland’s Future shall develop implementation plans  
7 consistent with the Comprehensive Implementation Plan that describe the goals,  
8 objectives, and strategies that will be used to improve student achievement and meet the  
9 Blueprint for Maryland’s Future recommendations for each segment of the student  
10 population.

11 (h) (1) For each of fiscal years 2022 through 2026, the governing body of a  
12 county and the local school system jointly shall appoint a single implementation  
13 coordinator responsible for the implementation of the Blueprint for Maryland’s Future by  
14 all government units operating in the county.

15 (2) **FOR EACH OF FISCAL YEARS 2026 AND 2027, EACH COUNTY**  
16 **BOARD SHALL PROVIDE \$150,000 FOR THE SALARY AND BENEFITS OF THE**  
17 **IMPLEMENTATION COORDINATOR APPOINTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH**  
18 **(1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.**

19 (3) **FUNDING FOR THE SALARY AND BENEFITS OF THE**  
20 **IMPLEMENTATION COORDINATOR PROVIDED BY THE COUNTY BOARD IN**  
21 **ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE PAID BY THE**  
22 **STATE AND THE COUNTY IN THE SAME PROPORTION AS THE FOUNDATION PROGRAM**  
23 **UNDER § 5–213 OF THIS TITLE.**

24 5–410.

25 (a) In addition to its own assessments and tracking of progress, required under §  
26 5–406 of this subtitle, the Board shall contract with a public or private entity to conduct an  
27 independent evaluation of the State’s progress in implementing the Blueprint for  
28 Maryland’s Future and achieving the expected outcomes during the implementation period.

29 (b) The independent evaluation shall include an assessment of:

30 (1) The use of additional funding to meet the goals of the Blueprint for  
31 Maryland’s Future;

32 (2) Progress toward the goals of the Blueprint for Maryland’s Future and  
33 whether the goals have been achieved; and

1 (3) Any recommendations to alter the goals or strategies employed to reach  
2 the goals, including new uses for existing funds or additional funding.

3 (c) (1) An entity with which the Board contracts for an independent evaluation  
4 shall report its results to the Board on or before:

5 (i) [October 1, 2024] **DECEMBER 1, 2026**; and

6 (ii) October 1, 2030.

7 (2) The Board shall contract for each independent evaluation as soon as  
8 practicable.

9 (d) (1) (i) On or before [December 1, 2024] **JANUARY 15, 2027**, the Board  
10 shall, using the first independent evaluation and its own judgment, report to the Governor  
11 and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly  
12 on whether the Blueprint for Maryland’s Future is being implemented as intended and  
13 achieving the expected outcomes.

14 (ii) The Board’s report shall include an assessment of the State’s  
15 progress towards:

16 1. Increasing the number of teachers achieving National  
17 Board Certification;

18 2. Providing full-day prekindergarten programs for 3- and  
19 4-year-olds in accordance with Title 7, Subtitle 1A of this article;

20 3. Improving behavioral health services in accordance with §  
21 7–447 of this article; and

22 4. Ensuring that students enrolled in public schools meet  
23 college and career standards in accordance with § 7–205.1 of this article.

24 (iii) The Board’s report shall include any legislative or structural  
25 corrections necessary to fully implement the Blueprint.

26 (2) On or before December 1, 2030, the Board shall report on the results of  
27 the final independent evaluation to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the  
28 State Government Article, the General Assembly.

29 (3) The Board’s reports under this subsection shall include:

30 (i) Practices being used to close achievement gaps between students  
31 of different groups listed in § 5–408(a)(2)(i) of this subtitle;

1 (ii) Progress made in closing the achievement gaps listed under item  
2 (i) of this paragraph; and

3 (iii) Assessments of student outcomes listed under § 5–408(a)(2)(ii) of  
4 this subtitle, disaggregated by race, income, ethnicity, and gender.

### 5 Chapter 36 of the Acts of 2021

6 SECTION 16. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

7 (d) In the independent evaluation and report to be submitted to the Governor and  
8 the General Assembly on or before [December 1, 2024] **JANUARY 15, 2027**, as required  
9 under § 5–410(d)(1) of the Education Article as enacted by this Act, the Accountability and  
10 Implementation Board shall report whether the Blueprint for Maryland’s Future is being  
11 implemented as intended and is achieving expected outcomes.

12 (e) (1) If the Accountability and Implementation Board does not report that  
13 the Blueprint for Maryland’s Future is being implemented as intended and is achieving  
14 expected outcomes in accordance with subsection (d) of this section, then:

15 (i) notwithstanding any other provision of law, per pupil increases  
16 in major education aid required under this Act for the fiscal year [2026] **2028** and each  
17 year thereafter shall be limited to the rate of inflation, as defined by § 5–201(h) of the  
18 Education Article as enacted by this Act;

19 (ii) notwithstanding any other provision of law, any additional  
20 funding increases required under this Act shall be limited to the rate of inflation as defined  
21 in § 5–201(h) of the Education Article as enacted by this Act; and

22 (iii) subject to subsection (f) of this section and notwithstanding any  
23 other provision of law, local school systems are not required to meet the additional  
24 requirements of this Act that begin in fiscal year [2026] **2028** and each fiscal year  
25 thereafter.

26 (2) If the Accountability and Implementation Board reports that the  
27 Blueprint for Maryland’s Future is not being implemented as intended and is not achieving  
28 expected outcomes, it is the intent of the General Assembly that the General Assembly  
29 shall take immediate action to adjust the formula and policies under this Act to achieve the  
30 goals of the Blueprint for Maryland’s Future in order to fulfill the General Assembly’s  
31 commitment to provide the resources, supports, and funding to fully implement the  
32 Blueprint for Maryland’s Future.

33 (f) A local school system shall continue to fund the requirements of this Act in  
34 effect prior to fiscal year [2026] **2028**.

35 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July  
36 1, 2024.
