A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Chesapeake Bay Water Transportation Network

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Transportation and the Maryland Transit Administration to study and examine the feasibility and practicality of using the 4 5 Chesapeake Bay and its navigable waters as a water transportation network to link 6 waterfront communities along the Chesapeake Bay; requiring the Department and 7 the Administration to prepare a certain inventory of facilities on the Chesapeake 8 Bay; requiring the Department and the Administration to estimate the cost of 9 implementing a Chesapeake Bay Water Transportation Network; making a stylistic change; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the 10 11 Chesapeake Bay Water Transportation Network.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 21 (a) It is the policy of this title to promote an efficient and economical 22 transportation system.
- 23 (b) The Department [of Transportation] and the State Highway Administration 24 may not proceed to the final project planning phase unless it has been determined that the

- 1 objective of the proposed project cannot be reasonably achieved through:
- 2 (1) Improvements in highway maintenance and safety;
- 3 (2) Projects that modify existing highways but provide for minimal 4 relocation or new highway construction; and
- 5 (3) Improvements in, or adoption of, transit alternatives, including mass 6 transit alternatives.
- 7 (C) AS PART OF THE STRATEGY TO DEVELOP AND PROMOTE AN EFFICIENT 8 AND ECONOMICAL TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM, THE DEPARTMENT AND THE 9 MARYLAND TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION SHALL:
- 10 (1) STUDY AND EXAMINE THE FEASIBILITY AND PRACTICALITY OF 11 USING THE CHESAPEAKE BAY AND ITS NAVIGABLE WATERS AS A WATER
- 12 TRANSPORTATION NETWORK TO LINK WATERFRONT COMMUNITIES ALONG THE
- 13 CHESAPEAKE BAY BY USING HIGH-SPEED WATER TAXIS AND OTHER VESSELS TO
- 14 TRANSPORT RESIDENTS AND VISITORS TO EMPLOYMENT CENTERS, RECREATIONAL
- 15 FACILITIES, AND ACTIVITIES ALONG THE CHESAPEAKE BAY;
- 16 (2) Prepare an inventory of facilities on the Chesapeake
- 17 BAY THAT MIGHT BE USED IN CONNECTION WITH THE TRANSPORT OF RESIDENTS
- 18 AND VISITORS BETWEEN WATERFRONT COMMUNITIES ALONG THE CHESAPEAKE
- 19 **BAY**;
- 20 (3) ESTIMATE THE COST OF IMPLEMENTING A CHESAPEAKE BAY
- 21 WATER TRANSPORTATION NETWORK FOR THE TRANSPORT OF RESIDENTS AND
- 22 VISITORS BY WATER TAXIS AND OTHER VESSELS BETWEEN WATERFRONT
- 23 COMMUNITIES ALONG THE CHESAPEAKE BAY; AND
- 24 (4) ON OR BEFORE JUNE 30, 2022, REPORT ITS FINDINGS TO THE
- 25 GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT
- 26 ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
- 27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
- 28 1, 2020. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2022,
- 29 this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and
- 30 of no further force and effect.
