Mr. CARTWRIGHT (for himself, Mr. ROGERS of Kentucky, Mr. BISHOP of Georgia, Mr. COSTA, Mr. PAPPAS, Mrs. BUSTOS, and Mr. BALDERSON) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Agriculture

A BILL

To establish a White House Rural Council, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Transforming Hiring

5 in Rural Industries and Vital Economies Act of 2020".

6 SEC. 2. WHITE HOUSE RURAL COUNCIL.

7 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established in the
8 Executive Office of the President a White House Rural
9 Council (in this section referred to as the "Council").

10 (b) Membership.—

1	(1) CHAIR.—The Secretary of Agriculture shall
2	serve as the Chair of the Council.
3	(2) Members.—The Council shall be composed
4	of the heads of the following:
5	(A) The Department of the Treasury.
6	(B) The Department of Defense.
7	(C) The Department of Justice.
8	(D) The Department of the Interior.
9	(E) The Department of Commerce.
10	(F) The Department of Labor.
11	(G) The Department of Health and
12	Human Services.
13	(H) The Department of Housing and
14	Urban Development.
15	(I) The Department of Transportation.
16	(J) The Department of Energy.
17	(K) The Department of Education.
18	(L) The Department of Veterans Affairs.
19	(M) The Department of Homeland Secu-
20	rity.
21	(N) The Environmental Protection Agency.
22	(O) The Federal Communications Commis-
23	sion.
24	(P) The Office of Management and Budg-
25	et.

(Q) The Office of Science and Technology
Policy.
(R) The Office of National Drug Control
Policy.
(S) The Council of Economic Advisers.
(T) The Domestic Policy Council.
(U) The National Economic Council.
(V) The Small Business Administration.
(W) The Council on Environmental Qual-
ity.
(X) The White House Office of Public En-
gagement and Intergovernmental Affairs.
(Y) The White House Office of Cabinet Af-
fairs.
(Z) Any other department, agency, or of-
fice of the executive branch as the President or
Secretary of Agriculture may designate.
(3) Designees.—Any member of the Council
may designate a senior-level official, who is employed
full-time in the department, agency, or office of such
member, to carry out the duties of the member
under this section.

(c) MEETINGS.—Not later than six months after the
date of the enactment of this Act, and every six months
thereafter, the Council shall convene a meeting of rep-

resentatives of the executive departments, agencies, and
 offices represented on the Council to develop plans to co ordinate the efforts of such executive departments, agen cies, and offices and facilitate efficient services to stake holders. At such meetings, each such representative
 shall—

7 (1) share information regarding the rural eco8 nomic development efforts and activities of the rep9 resentative's executive department, agency, or office;

10 (2) identify opportunities for collaboration and
11 coordination of research agendas, vulnerability as12 sessments, data collection and analysis, and plan13 ning and implementing rural economic development
14 projects;

(3) identify rural economic development information needs, research gaps, and decision support
needs that are not met by any executive department,
agency, or office represented on the Council and
make available such identification for purposes of information to be submitted to the Council;

(4) identify common and complementary goals
for rural economic development within each region
to be prioritized for the coming year and beyond;

24 (5) identify barriers to rural economic develop-25 ment planning and implementation that can be over-

1	come or minimized through Federal action and spe-
2	cific suggestions for improvement;
3	(6) evaluate progress and jointly develop a
4	strategy for realizing rural economic development-re-
5	lated goals, including clearly identified responsibil-
6	ities by each collaborating regional office, center, or
7	program; and
8	(7) share experiences and best practices in
9	stakeholder engagement and communication, deci-
10	sion support, and economic development interactions
11	that support the realization of identified rural eco-
12	nomic development goals.
13	(d) DUTIES.—The Council shall carry out the fol-
14	lowing:
15	(1) Coordinate with the Domestic Policy Coun-
16	cil and the National Economic Council to develop
17	the policy of the Council.
18	(2) Coordinate with departments, agencies, and
19	offices of the executive branch to develop policy rec-
20	ommendations that promote economic prosperity and
21	anality of life in mural areas (as defined by the See
22	quality of life in rural areas (as defined by the Sec-
22	retary of Agriculture) throughout the United States.

on how to best use Federal investments in rural
 areas for the purpose of facilitating job growth and
 economic development.

4 (4) Coordinate and increase the effectiveness of 5 Federal engagement with rural stakeholders, includ-6 ing agricultural organizations, small businesses, edu-7 cation and training institutions, health care pro-8 viders, telecommunications services providers, re-9 search and land grant institutions, law enforcement, State, local, and Tribal governments, and non-10 11 governmental organizations regarding the needs of 12 rural areas throughout the United States.

13 (5) Coordinate Federal efforts directed toward
14 the growth and development of geographic regions
15 that encompass both urban and rural areas.

16 (6) Identify and facilitate rural economic oppor-17 tunities associated with energy development, outdoor 18 recreation, and other conservation-related activities. 19 (e) ADMINISTRATION.—The Secretary of Agriculture 20 (or staff designated by the Secretary) shall provide to the 21 Council administrative support services and additional re-22 sources, as appropriate, to the extent permitted by law and 23 within existing appropriations. The Secretary shall deter-24 mine the amount of funding and personnel necessary for 25 the Council to carry out its duties and the amount of fund-

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ing and personnel each department, agency, or office rep resented on the Council should contribute in order for the
 Council to carry out such duties. Such department, agen cy, or office shall, upon the request of the Secretary, make
 available to the Council personnel, administrative support
 services, and information.

7 (f) NO ADDITIONAL FUNDS AUTHORIZED.—No addi8 tional funds are authorized to carry out the requirements
9 of this section. Such requirements shall be carried out
10 using amounts otherwise authorized.

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
