# A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

# 2 State Prescription Drug Benefits – Retiree Benefits – Revisions

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the date on which the State shall discontinue certain 4 prescription drug benefits to certain persons if a certain event occurs; altering the  $\mathbf{5}$ date by which the Department of Budget and Management is required to establish 6 certain retiree prescription drug coverage programs; altering the eligibility criteria 7 for participation in the retiree prescription drug coverage programs; altering the list 8 of recipients to whom the Secretary of Budget and Management is required to send 9 a certain notice of changes in a certain prescription drug benefit plan; and generally 10 relating to the State prescription drug benefits for retirees.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

# Article – State Personnel and Pensions

(a) (1) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, the State shall
continue to include a prescription drug benefit plan in the health insurance benefit options
established under the Program and available to retirees under §§ 2–508 and 2–509 of this
subtitle notwithstanding the enactment of the federal Medicare Prescription Drug,
Improvement, and Modernization Act of 2003 or any other federal law permitting states to
discontinue prescription drug benefit plans to retirees of a state.

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(2) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section:
