BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 317.24 and 317.241 of the Revised	8
Code be amended to read as follows:	9
Sec. 317.24. (A) As used in this section:	10
(1) "Authorized party" means any of the following:	11
(a) The person who is the subject of the record of	12
discharge;	13
(b) A county veterans service officer who is certified by	14
the department of veterans services;	15
(c) An attorney-in-fact, agent, or other representative of	16

(2) "Separation code" or "separation program number" means	26

(3) "Service-related document" means any United States	37
department of defense form DD-215 or DD-220, or any National	38
Guard Bureau form NGB-22 or NGB-22A.	39
(4) "Armed forces of the United States" means the army,	40
navy, air force, marine corps, space force, coast guard, the	41
national guard of any state, or any other reserve components of	42
those forces.	43
(5) "Uniformed services" means the armed forces of the	44

United States; the commissioned corps of the national oceanic
and atmospheric administration; the commissioned corps of the
public health service; or any reserve components of those
forces; and such other service as may be designated by congress.

(B)(1) Upon request of any discharged member of the armed

- forces of the United States uniformed services and presentation of the member's discharge, the county recorder shall record the discharge in a book to be furnished by the board of county commissioners for that purpose. There shall be no fee for the recording. The record of discharge, or a certified copy of the record, shall be received in evidence in all cases where the original discharge would be received.
- (2) (a) A discharge recorded under division (B) (1) or (D) of this section is not a public record under section 149.43 of the Revised Code for a period of seventy-five years after the date of the recording. During that period, the county recorder's office shall make the record of discharge available only to an authorized party or to a person other than an authorized party as provided by division (B) (2) (b) of this section. Except as provided in section 317.27 of the Revised Code, the authorized party shall pay the reasonable costs of copying the record of discharge.
- (b) A person other than an authorized party may request to view or receive a copy of a discharge record recorded under division (B)(1) or (D) of this section. Upon such a person's request, the county recorder's office shall provide a copy of the discharged record to the person that shall be redacted to contain only the name, rank, date of birth, date of discharge, and type of discharge of the person who is the subject of the discharge record. Except as provided in section 317.27 of the

Revised Code, a person other than an authorized party shall pay	75
the reasonable costs of copying the record of discharge.	76
(3) A county veterans service officer, who is an	77
authorized party, may request to receive, from a county	78
recorder's office, a record of discharge if the veterans service	79
officer has a need for access to the record of discharge for the	80
purpose of supporting a veteran's claim for benefits, and the	81
county recorder's office shall make the record available to the	82
county veterans service officer.	83
(C) Upon application by a person whose discharge has been	84
recorded pursuant to this section, the county recorder shall,	85
without fee, expunge the person's record of discharge, expunge	86
the person's separation program number or separation code from	87
the person's record of discharge and from any of the person's	88
other service-related documents that have been recorded, or	89
expunge the person's social security number from the person's	90
record of discharge and from any of the person's other service-	91
related documents that have been recorded. The application shall	92

(D) Upon the request of any person who served during World	111
War I or World War II as a member of any armed force of the	112
government of Poland or Czechoslovakia and participated while so	113
serving in armed conflict with an enemy of the United States and	114
who has been a citizen of the United States for at least ten	115
years, and the presentation of the person's discharge, the	116
county recorder shall record the person's discharge in a book to	117
be furnished by the board of county commissioners for that	118
purpose. No fee shall be charged for the recording. The record,	119
or a certified copy of it, shall be received in evidence in all	120
cases where the original would be received.	121
Sec. 317.241. (A) The board of county commissioners may by	122
resolution allow the county recorder or county veterans service	123
office to issue Ohio veterans identification cards to	124
individuals who have met the following requirements:	125
(1) Presented the individual's armed forces uniformed	126
services discharge record for recording in the record of	127
discharges in the office of the county recorder;	128
(2) Provided, while appearing in person at a county	129
recorder's office or county veterans service office, two forms	130

A board of county commissioners may, by resolution,	135
authorize a county recorder or county veterans service office to	136
collect a fee from individuals requesting a veterans	137
identification card. The fee may not exceed two dollars.	138
If a county veterans service office maintains access to	139
the state and federal military service verification system, the	140
county veterans service office or county recorder, by consulting	141
the county veterans service office, shall confirm before issuing	142
a veterans identification card that the individual's armed	143
forces uniformed services discharge record exists in the	144
system's database and does not indicate the individual was	145
dishonorably discharged.	146
(B) A county recorder or county veterans service office	147
who has in operation, before the effective date of this section	148
September 8, 2016, a program to issue veterans identification	149
cards may continue to issue veterans identification cards	150
without a resolution of the board of county commissioners, if	151
the county recorder or county veterans service office conforms	152
the program, as necessary, so that it otherwise is in compliance	153
with this section.	154
(C) An Ohio veterans identification card expires ten years	155
after the date of issuance. A veteran whose identification card	156
has expired may apply to a county recorder or county veterans	157
service office for the issuance of a new identification card,	158
and a veteran whose current card has been lost or damaged may	159

apply to a county recorder or county veterans service office for

a replacement identification card, by meeting the requirements	161

(F)(1) An Ohio veterans identification card shall conform	185
to the material and design standards established by the Ohio	186

follow the design standards established pursuant to Sec. section	190

(2) An applicant for an Ohio veterans identification card	192
shall be photographed in color at the time the application for	193
the card is made. A county recorder or county veterans service	194
office that issues identification cards shall provide the	195
necessary equipment to take a color photograph of an applicant	196
for an Ohio veterans identification card. Photographic records	197
of a county recorder's office or county veterans service office	198
that are obtained under this section are the property of the	199

(G) All application materials, including applications,	201
photographs, documents, or other information submitted with an	202

service office are not public records under section 149.43 of	204

(1) To a state, local, or federal governmental agency for	207
criminal justice purposes or to a court for any purpose arising	208

(J) For purposes of this section, "uniformed services" has	224
