A BILL

- To direct the Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Communications and Information to make grants for the establishment or expansion of internet exchange facilities, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Internet Exchange Act
- 5 of 2019".

6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

7 In this Act:

(1) ASSISTANT SECRETARY.—The term "Assist ant Secretary" means the Assistant Secretary of
 Commerce for Communications and Information.

4 (2)CORE BASED STATISTICAL AREA.—The term "core based statistical area" has the meaning 5 6 given the term by the Office of Management and Budget in the Notice of Decision entitled "2010 7 8 Standards for Delineating Metropolitan and 9 Micropolitan Statistical Areas", published in the 10 Federal Register on June 28, 2010 (75 Fed. Reg. 11 37246), or any successor to that Notice.

12 (3) COVERED GRANT.—The term "covered
13 grant" means a grant awarded under section 3(a).
14 (4) INTERNET EXCHANGE FACILITY.—The term

15 "internet exchange facility" means physical infra16 structure through which internet service providers
17 and content delivery networks exchange internet
18 traffic between their networks.

19 SEC. 3. NATIONAL TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMA20 TION ADMINISTRATION GRANTS.

(a) GRANTS.—On and after the first day of the first
fiscal year beginning after the date on which the Assistant
Secretary establishes rules and timelines under subsection
(d), the Assistant Secretary shall award grants to entities
to acquire real property and necessary equipment to—

(1) establish a new internet exchange facility in
 a core based statistical area in which, at the time
 the grant is awarded, there are no existing internet
 exchange facilities; or

5 (2) expand operations at an existing internet 6 exchange facility in a core based statistical area in 7 which, at the time the grant is awarded, there is 8 only 1 internet exchange facility.

9 (b) ELIGIBILITY.—An entity may not receive a cov-10 ered grant unless the entity certifies to the Assistant Sec-11 retary that the entity has sufficient interest from third 12 party entities that will use the internet exchange facility 13 to be funded by the grant once the facility is established 14 or operations are expanded, as applicable.

(c) FEDERAL SHARE.—The Federal share of the
total cost of the establishment of, or expansion of operations at, an internet exchange facility for which a covered
grant is awarded may not exceed 50 percent.

19 (d) Applications.—

20 (1) RULES AND TIMELINES.—Not later than 1
21 year after the date of enactment of this Act, the As22 sistant Secretary shall establish rules and timelines
23 for applications for covered grants.

24 (2) THIRD PARTY REVIEW.—To prevent fraud
25 in the covered grant program, the Assistant Sec-

retary shall enter into a contract with an independent third party under which the third party reviews an application for a covered grant not later
than 60 days after the date on which the application
is submitted to ensure that only an entity that is eligible for a covered grant receives a covered grant.

7 (e) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this sec8 tion shall be construed to authorize the Assistant Sec9 retary to regulate, issue guidance for, or otherwise inter10 fere with the activities at an internet exchange facility.

(f) NO ADDITIONAL FUNDS AUTHORIZED.—No additional funds are authorized to be appropriated to carry
out this section. This section shall be carried out using
amounts otherwise authorized.

15 SEC. 4. USE OF E-RATE AND RURAL HEALTH CARE UNI16 VERSAL SERVICE SUPPORT.

17 Section 254 of the Communications Act of 1934 (4718 U.S.C. 254) is amended by adding at the end the fol-19 lowing:

20 "(m) USE OF E-RATE AND RURAL HEALTH CARE
21 SUPPORT FOR COSTS RELATING TO INTERNET EX22 CHANGE FACILITY CONNECTION.—

23 "(1) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other
24 provision of law or regulation, including subpart F
25 or G of part 54 of title 47, Code of Federal Regula-

1	tions (or any successor regulation), a recipient of
2	support under such subpart F or G may receive sup-
3	port under that subpart—
4	"(A) to contract with a broadband internet
5	service provider to obtain connection to an
6	internet exchange facility; or
7	"(B) for the costs of maintaining a point
8	of presence at an internet exchange facility.
9	"(2) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in
10	this subsection shall be construed to authorize the
11	Commission to regulate, issue guidance for, or other-
12	wise interfere with the activities at an internet ex-
13	change facility.
14	"(3) INTERNET EXCHANGE FACILITY DE-
15	FINED.—In this subsection, the term 'internet ex-
16	change facility' means physical infrastructure
17	through which internet service providers and content
18	delivery networks exchange internet traffic between
19	their networks.".
