A BILL

To provide for grants from the Attorney General to local education agencies to purchase and install devices that would allow for the immediate notification of appropriate officials in case of emergency, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Securing Our Schools
5 Act of 2018”.

1 **SEC. 2. PILOT PROGRAM.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—For each of fiscal years 2019
3 through 2022, the Attorney General may make a grant
4 to a local education agency to acquire and install a device
5 that allows for immediate notification of emergency re-
6 sponse personnel, law enforcement, or other appropriate
7 officials (as determined by the local education agency) in
8 the case of an emergency, including a health emergency,
9 reports of an assailant armed with a weapon, an act of
10 terrorism, a natural disaster, or other similar emergency,
11 as determined by the local education agency.

12 (b) APPLICATION.—An application for a grant under
13 this section shall be submitted at such time, in such man-
14 ner, and containing such information as the Attorney Gen-
15 eral may require.

16 (c) MATCHING REQUIREMENT.—The portion of the
17 costs of a device acquired and installed pursuant to this
18 section that is provided by a grant under subsection (a)
19 may not exceed 75 percent.

20 (d) MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF GRANT.—A grant under
21 this section may not be in an amount greater than
22 \$200,000 for fiscal year.

23 (e) TERM OF GRANT.—A grant under this section
24 shall be for a term of one fiscal year.
