## A BILL

To redesignate the Martin Luther King, Junior, National  
Historic Site in the State of Georgia, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Martin Luther King,  
5 Jr. National Historical Park Act of 2017”.

6 **SEC. 2. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. NATIONAL HISTORICAL**  
7 **PARK.**

8 The Act entitled “An Act to establish the Martin Lu-  
9 ther King, Junior, National Historic Site in the State of

1 Georgia, and for other purposes” (Public Law 96–428)  
 2 is amended—

3 (1) in subsection (a) of the first section, by  
 4 striking “the map entitled ‘Martin Luther King,  
 5 Junior, National Historic Site’, numbered 489/  
 6 80,013B, and dated September 1992” and inserting  
 7 “the map entitled ‘Martin Luther King, Jr. National  
 8 Historical Park Proposed Boundary Revision’, num-  
 9 bered 489/128,786 and dated June 2015”;

10 (2) by striking “Martin Luther King, Junior,  
 11 National Historic Site” each place it appears and in-  
 12 serting “Martin Luther King, Jr. National Histor-  
 13 ical Park”;

14 (3) by striking “national historic site” each  
 15 place it appears and inserting “national historical  
 16 park”; and

17 (4) by striking “historic site” each place it ap-  
 18 pears and inserting “historical park”.

19 **SEC. 3. REFERENCES.**

20 Any reference in a law (other than this Act), map,  
 21 regulation, document, paper, or other record of the United  
 22 States to “Martin Luther King, Junior, National Historic  
 23 Site” shall be deemed to be a reference to “Martin Luther  
 24 King, Jr. National Historical Park”.
