A BILL

To require the Department of Homeland Security to prepare a terrorism threat assessment relating to unmanned aircraft systems, and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Protecting Critical In-
5	frastructure Against Drones and Emerging Threats Act".
6	SEC. 2. DRONE AND EMERGING THREAT ASSESSMENT.
7	(a) In General.—Not later than 120 days after the
8	date of enactment of this Act, the Under Secretary for Intel-
9	ligence and Analysis of the Department of Homeland Secu-
10	rity shall—
11	(1) in consultation with other relevant officials
12	of the Department, request additional information
13	from other agencies of the Federal Government, State
14	and local government agencies, and the private sector
15	relating to threats of unmanned aircraft systems and
16	other emerging threats associated with such new tech-
17	nologies;
18	(2) in consultation with relevant officials of the
19	Department and other appropriate agencies of the
20	Federal Government, develop and disseminate a secu-
21	rity threat assessment regarding unmanned aircraft
22	systems and other emerging threats associated with
23	such new technologies; and
24	(3) establish and utilize, in conjunction with the
25	Chief Information Officer of the Department and

- 1 other relevant entities, a secure communications and 2 information technology infrastructure, including data-mining and other advanced analytical tools, in 3 4 order to access, receive, and analyze data and information in furtherance of the responsibilities under 5 6 this section, including by establishing a voluntary 7 mechanism whereby critical infrastructure owners 8 and operators may report information on emerging 9 threats, such as the threat posed by unmanned air-10 craft systems.
- 11 (b) Report.—Not later than one year after the date 12 of the enactment of this Act, the Under Secretary for Intelligence and Analysis of the Department of Homeland Security shall prepare a threat assessment and report to the 14 15 Committee on Homeland Security of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Homeland Security and 16 Governmental Affairs of the Senate on the threat posed by unmanned aircraft systems, including information collected 18 from critical infrastructure owners and operators and Federal, State, and local government agencies. Such assessment 21 and report shall also include a classified plan to mitigate 22 such threat, as appropriate.
- 23 (c) Definitions.—
- 24 (1) Critical infrastructure" has the meaning given such

- 3 (2) Unmanned aircraft system" has the meaning given 4 "unmanned aircraft system" has the meaning given 5 such term in section 331 of the FAA Modernization 6 and Reform Act of 2012 (49 U.S.C. 40101 note; Pub-7 lic Law 112–95).
