A BILL

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to prohibit certain advertising with respect to the Immigration Detention Ombudsman, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "No Funding for Illegal
- 5 Migrant Billboards Act".

SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON CERTAIN ADVERTISING WITH RE
SPECT TO THE IMMIGRATION DETENTION
OMBUDSMAN.
Section 405 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002
(6 U.S.C. 205) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
lowing new subsection:
"(f) ADVERTISEMENT.—The Secretary may not obli-
gate or expend any funds to advertise to the general pub-
lie, by billboard or otherwise, the office or functions of the
