A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on Maternal Mortality; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, women in the United States are more likely to die of childbirth or
- 3 pregnancy-related causes than are women in other high-income countries; and
- 4 WHEREAS, according to numerous organizations that rank mortality rates, Georgia is
- 5 among the top ten states with the highest maternal death rate; and
- 6 WHEREAS, maternal deaths are a serious public health concern and have a tremendous
- 7 family and societal impact, affecting diverse populations; and
- 8 WHEREAS, maternal deaths are significantly underestimated and inadequately documented,
- 9 preventing efforts to identify, reduce, or eliminate the causes of death; and
- 10 WHEREAS, more evidence is needed to better understand the actual causes of maternal
- death, but research suggests that half of these deaths may be preventable; and
- 12 WHEREAS, there is a need to identify, investigate, and disseminate findings regarding
- 13 maternal deaths and to develop strategies and institute systemic changes to decrease and
- 14 prevent maternal deaths in Georgia.
- 15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 16 (1) **Creation of House study committee.** There is created the House Study Committee
- on Maternal Mortality.
- 18 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of five members of the
- 19 House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- 20 Representatives. The Speaker shall designate a member of the committee as chairperson
- of the committee.

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22 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,

- issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 25 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- 26 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

29 (5) Allowances and funding.

- 30 (A) Members of the committee who are members of the General Assembly shall
- receive the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of
- Georgia Annotated.
- 33 (B) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member
- of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds
- necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
- appropriated to the House of Representatives.

37 (6) **Report.**

- 38 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
- include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
- same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
- subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- 42 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
- proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
- of this paragraph.
- 45 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
- abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- 47 A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
- 48 the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the
- House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu
- 51 thereof.
- 52 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2019.
