A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Education – Home–Based Instructional Days – Establishment

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a county board of education to develop a policy for public 4 schools in the county to use home-based instructional days during the school year $\mathbf{5}$ under certain circumstances; requiring a home-based instructional day policy to 6 include certain procedures for instruction, attendance, and notification, an outline of 7 the responsibilities of students and staff, input, and other information required by 8 the State Board of Education; requiring a county board to submit a home-based 9 instructional day policy to the State Board for approval; authorizing the State Board to adopt a certain model policy or issue certain guidance; requiring the State Board 1011 to approve, deny, or return for modification a home-based instructional day policy 12submitted by a county board; providing that a county board may not apply for a 13 certain adjustment to the school year for days in which school attendance occurs through home-based instruction; providing that certain provisions relating to 14 attendance do not apply to a child under the age of 18 years who receives 1516home-based instruction; defining a certain term; and generally relating to 17home-based instructional days.

16 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "HOME–BASED INSTRUCTIONAL DAY" MEANS A DAY 17 ON WHICH SCHOOL ATTENDANCE IS PROVIDED THROUGH REMOTE INSTRUCTION 18 BECAUSE NORMAL SCHOOL ATTENDANCE IS PREVENTED BY:

- 19 (1) NATURAL DISASTER;
- 20 (2) CIVIL DISASTER; OR
- 21 (3) SEVERE WEATHER CONDITIONS.

22 (B) (1) A COUNTY BOARD MAY DEVELOP A POLICY FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS 23 IN THE COUNTY TO USE HOME–BASED INSTRUCTIONAL DAYS DURING THE SCHOOL 24 YEAR.
