RESOLUTION

Requesting information on Azerbaijan's human rights practices pursuant to section 502B(c) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961.

- 2 SECTION 1. REQUEST FOR INFORMATION ON AZER-
- 3 BAIJAN'S HUMAN RIGHTS PRACTICES.
- 4 (a) Statement Requested.—The House of Rep-
- 5 resentatives requests that the Secretary of State, not later
- 6 than 30 days after the date of the adoption of this resolu-
- 7 tion, transmit to the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the
- 8 House of Representatives and the Committee on Foreign
- 9 Relations of the Senate, pursuant to section 502B(c) of
- 10 the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2304(c)),

1	a statement, prepared in collaboration with the Assistant
2	Secretary of State for Democracy, Human Rights, and
3	Labor and the Office of the Legal Adviser, regarding Azer-
4	baijan's human rights practices.
5	(b) Elements.—The statement submitted under
6	subsection (a) shall include the following elements:
7	(1) All available information about the observ-
8	ance and respect for human rights and fundamental
9	freedoms in Azerbaijan, including information con-
10	cerning alleged violations of internationally recog-
11	nized human rights by the Government of Azer-
12	baijan, including—
13	(A) unlawful or arbitrary killings;
14	(B) torture;
15	(C) cruel, inhuman, or degrading treat-
16	ment or punishment of detainees;
17	(D) political prisoners;
18	(E) arbitrary arrest or detention;
19	(F) restrictions on freedom of assembly
20	association, and movement;
21	(G) pervasive problems with the independ-
22	ence of the judiciary;
23	(H) forced disappearances;
24	(I) serious restrictions on freedom of
25	speech, expression, and the media;

1	(J) severe restrictions on political partici-
2	pation;
3	(K) discrimination against women and gen-
4	der-based violence;
5	(L) restrictions on religious freedom;
6	(M) serious restrictions on internet free-
7	dom; and
8	(N) existence of the worst forms of child
9	labor.
10	(2) A description of the steps that the United
11	States Government has taken—
12	(A) to promote respect for and observance
13	of human rights in Azerbaijan and by the Gov-
14	ernment of Azerbaijan, including in the context
15	of the conflict with Armenia and Artsakh
16	(Nagorno-Karabakh);
17	(B) to discourage any practices in Azer-
18	baijan that are inimical to internationally recog-
19	nized human rights; and
20	(C) to publicly or privately call attention
21	to, and disassociate the United States and any
22	security assistance provided for the Government
23	of Azerbaijan from, any practices described in
24	subparagraph (B).

- (3) An assessment from the Secretary of State, notwithstanding any practices described in paragraph (2)(B), whether extraordinary circumstances exist that necessitate a continuation of security assistance for Azerbaijan.
 - (4) If such circumstances exist, a description of the circumstances and the extent to which security assistance should be continued (subject to such conditions as Congress may impose under section 502B of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2304)).

(5) Other information, including—

- (A) an assessment from the Secretary of State of the likelihood that United States security assistance (as defined in section 502B(d) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2304(d))) will be used in support of Azerbaijani activities related to the conflict with Armenia, aggression against Nagorno-Karabakh (Artsakh), and the blockade of the Lachin Corridor;
- (B) a description and assessment of the actions that the United States Government is taking to ensure end use monitoring protocols

3	(C) an assessment of the impact of United

- (C) an assessment of the impact of United States assistance provided to Azerbaijan over the past 10 years on the balance of power between Azerbaijan and Armenia, and on efforts to negotiate a durable and lasting peace settlement between Armenia and Azerbaijan;
- (D) a description of the United States Government's efforts to implement the Leahy Law in Azerbaijan and ensure that no units implicated in gross violations of human rights receive United States assistance, including information on units that have been rejected in the Leahy vetting process;
- (E) an assessment from the Secretary of State of whether ethnic cleansing or genocidal acts are taking place in Nagorno-Karabakh; and
- (F) a description of any actions that the United States Government is taking to implement sanctions, including sanctions under the Global Magnitsky Human Rights Accountability Act and section 7031(c) of the Department of State, Foreign Operations, and Related Pro-

1	grams Appropriations Act, to hold accountable
2	Azerbaijani officials responsible for gross viola-
3	tions of human rights or significant corruption.

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
