2 SEC. 101. LICENSE TO OWN FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 44 of title 18, United

4 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-

5 lowing:

1	"§932. License to own firearms and ammunition
2	"(a) IN GENERAL.—Except otherwise provided in
3	this section, it shall be unlawful for any individual who
4	is not licensed under this section to knowingly purchase,
5	acquire, or possess a firearm or ammunition.
6	"(b) ELIGIBILITY.—An individual shall be eligible to
7	receive a license under this section if the individual—
8	"(1) has attained 21 years of age; and
9	"(2) has completed training in firearms safety,
10	including—
11	"(A) a written test, to demonstrate knowl-
12	edge of applicable firearms laws;
13	"(B) hands-on testing, including firing
14	testing, to demonstrate safe use of a firearm;
15	"(C) as part of the process for applying for
16	such a license—
17	"(i) has submitted to a background
18	investigation and criminal history check of
19	the individual, including a background
20	check using the National Instant Criminal
21	Background Check System, to ensure the
22	individual is not prohibited from possessing
23	a firearm under subsection (g) or (n) of
24	section 922; and
25	"(ii) has submitted a photograph of

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the individual;

1	"(D) has not been determined by a court,
2	in accordance with subsection $(c)(5)$, to be un-
3	suitable to be issued a Federal firearm owner's
4	license; and
5	"(E) is not otherwise prohibited by Fed-
6	eral, State, Tribal, or local law from possessing
7	a firearm.
8	"(c) Establishment of Federal Firearm
9	Owner's License.—
10	"(1) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney General shall
11	issue a Federal firearm owner's license to any indi-
12	vidual who is eligible under subsection (b).
13	"(2) Issuance of license or notice of de-
14	NIAL.—Not later than 40 days after the date on
15	which an individual submits an application for a
16	Federal firearm owner's license under this section,
17	the Attorney General shall—
18	"(A) determine whether the individual is
19	eligible to possess a license under this section;
20	and
21	"(B) based on the determination under
22	subparagraph (A)—
23	"(i) issue a Federal firearm owner's
24	license to the individual; or

1	"(ii) provide written notice to the in-
2	dividual of—
3	"(I) the determination that the
4	individual is ineligible to possess such
5	a license based on the requirements
6	described in subsection (b), which
7	shall include an explanation for the
8	determination; or
9	"(II) a petition filed under para-
10	graph (5) .
11	"(3) EXPIRATION.—A Federal firearm owner's
12	license issued under this section shall expire on the
13	date that is 10 years after the date on which the li-
14	cense was issued.
15	"(4) RENEWAL OF LICENSE.—
16	"(A) IN GENERAL.—A Federal firearm
17	owner's license issued under this section may be
18	renewed at the end of the 10-year period de-
19	scribed in paragraph (3).
20	"(B) REQUIREMENTS.—The process for
21	renewal of a Federal firearm owner's license
22	under subparagraph (A) shall include—
23	"(i) an up-to-date background inves-
24	tigation and criminal history check of the
25	individual; and

1	"(ii) a recent photograph of the indi-
2	vidual.
3	"(C) ISSUANCE OF RENEWAL OR NOTICE
4	OF DENIAL.—Not later than 40 days after the
5	date on which an individual submits an applica-
6	tion for a renewal of a Federal firearm owner's
7	license under this paragraph, the Attorney Gen-
8	eral shall—
9	"(i) issue a renewed Federal firearm
10	owner's license to the individual; and
11	"(ii) provide written notice to the in-
12	dividual of—
13	"(I) the determination that the
14	individual is ineligible to possess such
15	a license based on the requirements
16	described in subsection (b), which
17	shall include an explanation for the
18	determination; or
19	"(II) a petition filed under para-
20	graph (5) .
21	"(5) ATF DETERMINATION OF
22	UNSUITABILITY.—
23	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The Director of the
24	Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Ex-
25	plosives may file a petition, which shall contain

1	a written statement of the reasons supporting
2	the request required under subparagraph (C),
3	in an appropriate district court of the United
4	States to request that—
5	"(i) an individual who has applied for
6	a Federal firearm owner's license, or re-
7	newal thereof, under this section be denied
8	the request for such license; or
9	"(ii) a previously issued Federal fire-
10	arm owner's license be suspended or re-
11	voked.
12	"(B) NOTICE.—Any petition filed under
13	subparagraph (A) shall include written notice to
14	the individual who requested, or is in possession
15	of, the Federal firearm owner's license, as the
16	case may be, describing the facts and cir-
17	cumstances justifying the petition.
18	"(C) HEARING.—Not later than 90 days
19	after the date on which a petition is filed under
20	subparagraph (A), the court shall conduct a
21	hearing.
22	"(D) Factors to determine
23	UNSUITABILITY.—Not later than 15 days after
24	the date on which a hearing is conducted under
25	subparagraph (C), the court shall find that an

1	individual is unsuitable to possess a Federal
2	firearm owner's license if, based on a prepon-
3	derance of the evidence, there exists—
4	"(i) reliable, articulable, and credible
5	information that the individual has exhib-
6	ited or engaged in behavior to suggest the
7	individual could potentially create a risk to
8	public safety; or
9	"(ii) other existing factors that sug-
10	gest that the individual could potentially
11	create a risk to public safety.
12	"(E) NOTICE OF DETERMINATION.—If a
13	court finds an individual is unsuitable to pos-
14	sess a Federal firearm owner's license, the
15	court shall notify the applicant in writing, set-
16	ting forth the specific reasons for such deter-
17	mination.
18	"(6) REVIEW.—A determination of the Director
19	of Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explo-
20	sives or a district court of the United States under
21	this subparagraph may be appealed to the appro-
22	priate court of the United States.
23	"(d) EXCEPTIONS.—
24	"(1) PREVIOUSLY POSSESSED FIREARMS.—Sub-
25	section (a) shall not apply to the possession of any

1	firearm or ammunition by an individual who other-
2	wise lawfully possessed the firearm or ammunition
3	under Federal law on the date on which the Attor-
4	ney General begins issuing Federal firearm owner's
5	licenses under this section.
6	"(2) STATE LICENSES.—
7	"(A) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (a) shall
8	not apply to an individual in a State if the At-
9	torney General determines that the State—
10	"(i) has in effect a process for issuing
11	a State firearm owner's license to eligible
12	individuals in the State that is substan-
13	tially similar to the requirements of sub-
14	section (b); and
15	"(ii) provides to the Attorney General
16	real-time validity information relating to
17	firearm owner's licenses issued by the
18	State, for inclusion in the database de-
19	scribed in section (f).
20	"(B) PUBLICATION OF LIST OF QUALI-
21	FYING STATES.—
22	"(i) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 2
23	years after the date of enactment of the
24	Gun Violence Prevention and Community
25	Safety Act of 2020, the Attorney General

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1	shall publish a list of States that have in
2	effect a process described in subparagraph
3	(A).
4	"(ii) UPDATED LIST.—The Attorney
5	General shall update the list described in
6	clause (i) immediately upon determining
7	that a State should be included on or re-
8	moved from the list.
9	"(3) Licensed dealers, manufacturers,
10	AND IMPORTERS.—Subsection (a) shall not apply to
11	an individual who is a licensed dealer, licensed man-
12	ufacturer, or licensed importer.
13	"(4) Agencies and law enforcement offi-
14	CERS.—
15	"(A) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (a) shall
16	not apply to—
17	"(i) the importation for, manufacture
18	for, sale to, transfer to, or possession by
19	the United States or a department or
20	agency of the United States or a State or
21	a department, agency, or political subdivi-
22	sion of a State, or a sale or transfer to or
23	possession by a qualified law enforcement
24	officer employed by the United States or a
25	department or agency of the United States

1	or a State or a department, agency, or po-
2	litical subdivision of a State, for purposes
3	of law enforcement (whether on or off
4	duty), or a sale or transfer to or possession
5	by a campus law enforcement officer for
6	purposes of law enforcement (whether on
7	or off duty); or
8	"(ii) the importation for, or sale or
9	transfer to a licensee under title I of the
10	Atomic Energy Act of 1954 for purposes
11	of establishing and maintaining an on-site
12	physical protection system and security or-
13	ganization required by Federal law, or pos-
14	session by an employee or contractor of
15	such licensee on-site for such purposes or
16	off-site for purposes of licensee-authorized
17	training or transportation of nuclear mate-
18	rials.
19	"(B) DEFINITION.—For purposes of sub-
20	paragraph (A), the term 'campus law enforce-
21	ment officer' means an individual who is—
22	"(i) employed by a private institution
23	of higher education that is eligible for
24	funding under title IV of the Higher Edu-

1	cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1070 et
2	$\operatorname{seq.});$
3	"(ii) responsible for the prevention or
4	investigation of crime involving injury to
5	persons or property, including apprehen-
6	sion or detention of persons for such
7	crimes;
8	"(iii) authorized by Federal, State, or
9	local law to carry a firearm, execute search
10	warrants, and make arrests; and
11	"(iv) recognized, commissioned, or
12	certified by a government entity as a law
13	enforcement officer.
14	"(e) Prohibition of Straw Purchasing.—It shall
15	be unlawful for any person to willfully use a valid Federal
16	or State firearm license to purchase a firearm or ammuni-
17	tion on behalf of another individual, regardless of whether
18	the other individual has a valid Federal or State firearm
19	license.
20	"(f) PENALTIES.—Any person who violates sub-
21	section (a) or (e) shall be imprisoned not more than 2
22	years, fined in accordance with this title, or both.
23	"(g) DATABASE.—The Attorney General shall estab-
24	lish an electronic database, which shall be accessible by
25	Federal, State, local, and Tribal law enforcement agencies

and licensed dealers, through which a licensed dealer may
 verify the validity of a Federal firearm owner's license
 issued under this section.

4 "(h) REVOCATION OF LICENSES.—

5 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney General shall 6 revoke the Federal firearm owner's license issued to 7 an individual under this section upon the occurrence 8 of any event that would have disqualified the indi-9 vidual from being issued or renewed a Federal fire-10 arm owner's license under this section or for a viola-11 tion of a restriction provided under this section.

"(2) REQUIRED NOTICE.—Upon revocation of a
Federal firearm owner's license under paragraph
(1), the Attorney General shall provide written notice of such revocation to the individual to whom the
license was issued.

17 "(3) Appeal of revocation.—

18 "(A) IN GENERAL.—An individual who has
19 the Federal firearm owner's license of the indi20 vidual revoked under this subsection may ap21 peal the revocation determination to the Direc22 tor of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Fire23 arms and Explosives.

24 "(B) REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 14
25 days after the date on which an individual ap-

1	peals a revocation determination under sub-
2	paragraph (A), the Director of the Bureau of
3	Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives
4	shall conduct a hearing on the appeal.
5	"(C) NOTICE OF DETERMINATION.—The
6	Director of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco,
7	Firearms and Explosives shall provide written
8	notice of the determination made after a hear-
9	ing under subparagraph (B) regarding the ap-
10	pealed revocation to the individual.
11	"(D) APPEAL.—If the Director of the Bu-
12	reau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explo-
13	sives determines after a hearing under this
14	paragraph to uphold the revocation, the deter-
15	mination may be appealed to an appropriate
16	district court of the United States.
17	"(i) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
18	are authorized to be appropriated to the Attorney General
19	such sums as are necessary to carry out this section.".
20	(b) Clerical Amendment.—The table of sections
21	for such chapter is amended by adding at the end the fol-
22	lowing:
	"932. License to own firearms and ammunition.".

(c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
subsections (a) and (b) shall take effect on the date that
is 2 years after the date of enactment of this Act.

1 (d) REGULATIONS.—

2 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after 3 the date of enactment of this Act, the Attorney General shall promulgate regulations to carry out section 4 932 of title 18, United States Code, as added by 5 6 subsection (a), including a regulation requiring that 7 any firearm manufactured after the effective date 8 described in subsection (c) of this section be legibly 9 and conspicuously engraved or cast with the date on 10 which the firearm was manufactured.

(2) REQUIREMENT.—The Attorney General
shall conduct, not less frequently than annually, a
background investigation of each individual to whom
a Federal firearm owner's license is issued under
this section to ensure that the individual is not prohibited from possessing a firearm under subsection
(g) or (n) of section 922 or under State law.

(e) ANNUAL REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after
the date of enactment of this Act, and each year thereafter, the Attorney General shall submit a report to Congress on the implementation of section 932 of title 18,
United States Code, as added by subsection (a), and recommendations, if any, for improvements of the system required to be established under such section 932.

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1	((3) the term 'prohibited individual' means an
2	individual who is categorically ineligible to receive a
3	covered license;
4	"(4) the term 'suitable' means that an indi-
5	vidual does not create a risk to public safety; and
6	"(5) the term 'thorough background check'
7	means a Federal and State background check, which
8	may include a fingerprint-based background check.
9	"(b) Prohibited Individuals.—For purposes of
10	this part, a State—
11	((1) shall establish standards for categorizing
12	an individual as a prohibited individual for purposes
13	of receiving a covered license; and
14	((2) in establishing standards with respect to a
15	covered license under paragraph (1), shall take into
16	consideration whether limitations may be warranted
17	based on—
18	"(A) criminal history;
19	"(B) whether an individual has been—
20	"(i) deemed a danger to himself or
21	herself or other individuals by a court or
22	authorized administrative body; or
23	"(ii) committed to a hospital or insti-
24	tution as a danger to himself or herself or

2	"(D) legal residency;
3	"(E) military dishonorable discharges;
4	"(F) whether an individual is subject to a
5	permanent or temporary protection order or has
6	ever been convicted of a misdemeanor crime of
7	domestic violence;
8	"(G) outstanding arrest warrants;
9	"(H) status as a fugitive;
10	"(I) renunciation of United States citizen-
11	ship; and
12	"(J) other factors relevant to the suit-
13	ability of a license holder.
14	"SEC. 3052. GRANTS AND CONDITIONS.
15	"(a) GRANTS AUTHORIZED.—The Assistant Attorney
16	General may make grants to States to implement or main-
17	tain firearms and firearms dealer licensing requirements.
18	"(b) DURATION OF GRANTS.—A grant under sub-
19	section (a) shall be for a period of 3 fiscal years.

23	"(i) standards and a process under

24	"(F) providing intensive case management,
25	counseling or peer support services that reduce

1	individuals' risk of being victimized by, or per-
2	petrating, violence and that seek to interrupt
3	cycles of violence and retaliation in order to re-
4	duce the incidence of homicides, shootings, and
5	group-related violence.
6	"(d) PRIORITY.—In awarding grants under this sec-
7	tion, the Secretary shall give priority to programs oper-
8	ating in—
9	((1) the 127 municipalities that have had the
10	highest annual per capita homicide rates as meas-
11	ured over the most recent 5 years (among munici-
12	palities meeting certain population thresholds, as
13	specified by the Secretary); and
14	((2) other municipalities with substantial recent
15	increases in homicide rates, based on homicide data
16	reported to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, or
17	as otherwise specified by the Secretary.
18	"(e) GRANT RECIPIENT REPORTS.—Each recipient
19	of a grant under this section shall submit a biennial per-
20	formance report to the Secretary detailing how such grant
21	funds were used and the progress made towards address-
22	ing violence in the community during the applicable fund-
23	ing period under the grant.
24	"(f) Reports to Congress.—Not later than 2
25	years after the date on which the program under this sec-

tion commences, and every 2 years thereafter, the Sec retary shall submit a report to Congress detailing how
 funds appropriated for the grant program under this sec tion were used and recommendations for improvement of
 the program.

6 "(g) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
7 are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary to carry
8 out this section \$100,000,000 for each fiscal year.".

9 SEC. 902. FUNDING FOR RESEARCH ON FIREARMS SAFETY

OR GUN VIOLENCE PREVENTION.

11 (a) Department of Justice.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—There are authorized to be 12 13 appropriated to the Attorney General \$50,000,000 14 for each fiscal year for the purpose of conducting or 15 supporting research on firearms safety or gun vio-16 lence prevention. The amount authorized to be ap-17 propriated by the preceding sentence is in addition 18 to any other amounts authorized to be appropriated 19 for such purpose.

20 (2) REPORTS TO CONGRESS.—Not later than 2
21 years after the date of enactment of this Act, and
22 every 2 years thereafter, the Attorney General shall
23 submit a report to Congress detailing how the funds
24 authorized to be appropriated under this section
25 were used.

(b) DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERV 2 ICES.—

3 (1) IN GENERAL.—There are authorized to be 4 appropriated to the Secretary of Health and Human 5 Services \$50,000,000 for each fiscal year for the 6 purpose of conducting or supporting research on 7 firearms safety or gun violence prevention, including 8 conducting evaluations of the community violence 9 intervention grant program authorized under section 10 399V–7 of the Public Health Service Act (as added 11 by section 901 of this Act). The amount authorized 12 to be appropriated by the preceding sentence is in 13 addition to any other amounts authorized to be ap-14 propriated for such purpose.

15 (2) REPORTS TO CONGRESS.—Not later than 2 16 years after the date of enactment of this Act, and 17 every 2 years thereafter, the Secretary of Health 18 and Human Services shall submit a report to Con-19 gress detailing how the funds authorized to be ap-20 propriated under this section were used.

21 TITLE X—MISCELLANEOUS

22 SEC. 1001. SEVERABILITY.

If any provision of this Act or any amendment made
by this Act, or any application of such provision or amendment to any person or circumstance, is held to be invalid,

the remainder of the provisions of this Act and the amend ments made by this Act and the application of the provi sion or amendment to any other person or circumstance
 shall not be affected.
