A BILL

To revise sections 552, 1461, and 1462 of title 18, United

States Code, and section 305 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1305), and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Stop Comstock Act."
5	SEC. 2. OBSCENE MATERIALS.
6	(a) Title 18.—Part I of title 18, United States
7	Code, is amended—
8	(1) in section 552—
9	(A) by striking "or indecent"; and
10	(B) by striking "or means for procuring
11	abortion, or other articles of indecent or im-
12	moral use or tendency,";
13	(2) in section 1461—
14	(A) by striking "Every obscene, lewd, las-
15	civious" and all that follows through "Is de-
16	clared" and inserting "All obscene materials are
17	declared";
18	(B) by striking "or section 3001(e) of title
19	39"; and
20	(C) by striking "The term 'indecent" and
21	all that follows through "assassination."; and
22	(3) in section 1462—
23	(A) in the first undesignated paragraph—

1	(i) by striking "section 230(e)(2)"
2	and inserting "section 230(f)(2)"; and
3	(ii) by striking "commerce—" and all
4	that follows through "things may be ob-
5	tained or made" and inserting "commerce
6	any obscene material"; and
7	(B) in the second undesignated paragraph,
8	by striking "matter or thing the carriage or im-
9	portation of" and inserting "material".
10	(b) Tariff Act of 1930.—Section 305(a) of the
11	Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1305(a)) is amended—
12	(1) by striking "or immoral" and all that fol-
13	lows through "unlawful abortion"; and
14	(2) by striking "Provided, That the drugs" and
15	all that follows through "Provided further, That the
16	Secretary" and inserting "Provided, That the Sec-
17	retary".
