labeling and registration of organic products and certifying entities, is amended by revising

9 subsection (e) as follows: 10 "(e) On and after January 1, 2003, no person shall produce, process, distribute, or handle 11 in this state any advertised, promoted, identified, tagged, stamped, packaged, or labeled 12 organic food or feed ingredient, article, commodity, or product unless such person has first 13 registered with the department; provided, however, that retail food sales establishments 14 licensed under Article 2 of this chapter that do not process or repackage certified organic 15 commodities shall be exempt from registration provisions set forth in this chapter. On and after January 1, 2003, no organization, business, firm, or individual shall act as a certifying 16 17 entity in this state unless such organization, business, firm, or individual has first registered 18 with the department. The Commissioner shall establish by regulation registration standards for producers, processors, distributors, handlers, and certifying entities not inconsistent 19 with this chapter. Registration shall be made upon forms prescribed and furnished by the 20 21 department. Registrations shall expire on the last day of December of the year for which 22 they are issued. The Commissioner shall establish by rule a registration fee for certifying entities in an amount of not less than \$75.00 nor more than \$1,000.00 per annum and may 23

establish classes of certifying entities with different registration fees for each class. Any

fees collected pursuant to this Code section shall be retained pursuant to the provisions of
