4 This Act may be cited as the "TAP Promotion Act".

8 "(20) A presentation that promotes the benefits 9 available to veterans under the laws administered by 10 the Secretary of Veterans Affairs. Such presen-11 tation—

12 "(A) shall be standardized;

"(B) shall, before implementation, be reviewed and approved by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs in collaboration with veterans
service organizations that provide claims assistance under the benefits delivery at discharge
program of the Department of Veterans Affairs;
"(C) shall be submitted by the Secretary of

21 Affairs of the Senate and the Committee on
22 Veterans' Affairs of the House of Representa23 tives for review at least 90 days before imple24 mentation;

25 "(D) where available, shall be presented
26 with the participation of—

1 "(i) a representative of a veterans 2 service organization recognized under section 5902 of title 38; or 3 "(ii) an individual— 4 "(I) recognized under section 5 6 5903 of such title; and 7 "(II) authorized by the Secretary 8 concerned to so participate; 9 "(E) shall include information on how a 10 veterans service organization may assist the 11 member in filing a claim described in paragraph 12 (19);"(F) may not encourage the member to 13 14 join a particular veterans service organization; 15 and "(G) may not exceed one hour in dura-16 17 tion.". 18 (b) ANNUAL REPORT.—Not less than frequently than 19 once each year after the date of the enactment of this Act, 20 the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall submit to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and the Com-21 22 mittee on Veterans' Affairs of the House of Representa-23 tives a report that—

(1) identifies each veterans service organizationthat participated in a presentation under paragraph

(20) of section 1142(b) of title 10, United States
 Code, as added by subsection (a);
 (2) contains the number of members of the
 Armed Forces who attended such presentations; and
 (3) includes any recommendations of the Sec-

6 retary regarding changes to such presentation or to7 such paragraph.

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
