A BILL

To establish biennial budgets for the United States Government.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Biennial Budgeting3 and Enhanced Oversight Act of 2017".

4 TITLE I—CONGRESSIONAL 5 BUDGET PROCESS

6 SEC. 101. PURPOSES.

Paragraphs (1) and (2) of section 2 of the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 are
amended to read as follows:

10 "(1) to assure effective control over the budg-11 etary process;

12 "(2) to facilitate the determination biennially of
13 the appropriate level of Federal revenues and ex14 penditures by the Congress and the President;".

15 SEC. 102. DEFINITIONS.

Section 3 of the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 is amended by adding at the
end the following new paragraphs:

"(12) The term 'direct spending' has the meaning given to such term in section 250(c)(8) of the
Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control
Act of 1985.

23 "(13) The term 'biennium' means the period of
24 2 consecutive fiscal years beginning on October 1 of
25 any odd-numbered year.".

3 "(2) Subsection (a) does not apply with respect to 4 an authorization of appropriations for a single fiscal year 5 for any program, project, or activity if the measure containing that authorization includes a provision expressly 6 7 stating the following: 'Congress finds that no authoriza-8 tion of appropriation will be required for [Insert name of 9 applicable program, project, or activity] for any subse-10 quent fiscal year.'.

"(c) For purposes of this section, the term 'measure'
means a bill, joint resolution, amendment, motion, or conference report.".
