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## HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

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## Declaration of a Climate Emergency and Implementation of a Climate Mobilization Effort

FOR the purpose of declaring that a climate and ecological emergency threatens the State, the nation, civilization, humanity, and the natural world; committing the State to a statewide climate mobilization effort to reverse global warming and the current ecological crisis, end statewide greenhouse gas emissions by a certain year, draw down carbon from the atmosphere, and accelerate the development and implementation of adaptation and resilience strategies; calling on the U.S. Congress, the President of the United States, and all governments and people worldwide to declare a climate emergency, implement a climate mobilization effort to reverse global warming and the current ecological crisis, and provide maximum protection for all people and species of the world; and generally relating to the declaration of a climate emergency and implementation of a climate mobilization effort.

- WHEREAS, Restoring a safe and stable climate requires climate mobilization an emergency mobilization of resources on a scale not seen since World War II that will:
- 17 (1) reach zero greenhouse gas emissions across all sectors of the economy;
- 18 (2) rapidly and safely draw down and remove all the excess carbon from 19 the atmosphere at emergency speed and until safe pre—industrial climate conditions are 20 restored; and
- 21 (3) implement measures to protect all people and species from the 22 consequences of an abrupt climate breakdown; and
  - WHEREAS, Measures to restore a safe climate include:

possible but not later than 2030;

1	(1) a rapid, just, and managed phase—out of fossil fuels;
2 3	(2) ending the production of greenhouse gas emissions as quickly as possible to establish a zero–emissions economy;
4 5	(3) a widespread effort to safely draw down excess carbon from the atmosphere;
6	(4) a full transition to a regenerative agriculture system; and
7 8	(5) an end to the sixth mass extinction through widespread conservation and restoration of ecosystems; and
$\begin{array}{c} 9 \\ 10 \\ 11 \\ 12 \end{array}$	WHEREAS, Justice requires that frontline and marginalized communities, which have historically borne the brunt of the extractive fossil fuel economy, participate actively in the planning and implementation of this mobilization effort and that they benefit first from the transition to a climate—safe economy; and
13 14 15	WHEREAS, The massive scope and scale of action necessary to stabilize the climate and biosphere will require unprecedented levels of public awareness, engagement, and deliberation to develop and implement effective, just, and equitable policies to address the climate emergency; and
17 18	WHEREAS, The State of Maryland can act as a global leader by implementing an emergency climate mobilization effort to:
19 20	(1) convert the economy to an ecologically, socially, and economically regenerative local economy at emergency speed; and
21 22	(2) advocate for regional, national, and international efforts necessary to reverse global warming and the ecological crisis; now, therefore, be it
23 24 25	RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the State of Maryland declares that a climate and ecological emergency threatens our State, our nation, civilization, humanity, and the natural world; and be it further
26 27	RESOLVED, That the State of Maryland commits to a statewide climate mobilization effort to:
28	(1) reverse global warming and the current ecological crisis;

32 (3) immediately implement an effort to safely draw down carbon from the 33 atmosphere, thereby ensuring a just transition for residents; and

8 9	(3) provide maximum protection for all people and species of the world; and be it further
