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8	ESTABLISHING THE TASK FORCE TO COMBAT CURBSTONING.
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10	WHEREAS, there are concerns expressed about
11	potential abuses by unlicensed motor vehicle dealers involving
12	the illegal sale of used motor vehicles, otherwise known as
13	curbstoning; and
14	WHEREAS, curbstoners sell used vehicles under the
15	pretense of being the owner of the car in order to evade state
16	or city regulations imposed on authorized motor vehicle
17	dealers; and
18	WHEREAS, curbstoners put consumers at risk by
19	releasing unsafe vehicles into the streets, hurt local
20	businesses, and deny local governments the fees and tax
21	revenue needed to provide essential public services; and
22	WHEREAS, an initiative is necessary to further
23	explore the impact of curbstoning in the state, and to
24	eliminate this illegal practice that harms Alabama consumers,
25	motor vehicle dealers, financial institutions, and state and
26	local governments each year; now therefore,

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 2 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That there is established the Alabama Task Force to Combat Curbstoning. 3 (a) The task force shall be composed of the 5 following members: (1) The Director of the Motor Vehicle Division of 6 7 the Department of Revenue, who shall be the chair of the task force. 8 9 (2) One representative appointed by the Automobile 10 Dealers Association of Alabama. 11 (3) One representative appointed by the Alabama 12 Independent Auto Dealers Association. 13 (4) One representative appointed by the Alabama 14 Bankers Association. 15 (5) One representative appointed by the Alabama Credit Union Association. 16 17 (6) One representative appointed by the Alabama Association of Tax Administrators. 18 (7) One representative appointed by the Attorney 19 General's Office of Consumer Interest, appointed by the 20 21 Attorney General. (8) One consumer representative appointed by the 2.2 23 Speaker of the House of Representatives. 24 (9) One representative of the motor vehicle industry 25 appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

(b) There shall be no compensation for task force

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members.

- 1 (c) The appointing authorities shall coordinate
  2 their appointments to assure that the membership of the
  3 Alabama Task Force Combat Curbstoning is inclusive and
  4 reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and
  5 economic diversity of the state.
  - (d) The task force shall have the following
    responsibilities:

- (1) Research, compile information, and draft recommendations to combat the issues associated with curbstoning to the Legislature, including any recommended changes to the Code of Alabama 1975. The research shall include the examination of motor vehicle licensing laws of other states, as well as input and briefings from all sectors of the industry.
- (2) Based on the data and analysis of this state and laws and regulations of other states, draft a report that includes recommendations of potential measures and reforms related to curbstoning.
- (3) The task force shall report its findings, conclusions, and make recommendations to the Legislature no later than the first day of December 2017, whereupon it shall stand dissolved and discharged of any further duties and responsibilities.
