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Public Utilities – Gas Service Regulator Safety (Flower Branch Act)

4 FOR the purpose of requiring that any gas service newly installed at an occupied structure $\mathbf{5}$ may have a gas service regulator installed only outside the structure; requiring an 6 existing interior gas service regulator in a multifamily residential structure to be 7 relocated outside whenever a gas service line, meter, or regulator is replaced; 8 requiring an existing interior gas service regulator servicing a multifamily structure 9 to be relocated outside within a certain time period; requiring a gas company, on or 10 before a certain date, to file a plan with the Public Service Commission to relocate 11 any gas service regulator that provides service to a multifamily residential structure; 12 requiring the Commission, on or before a certain date, to approve, disapprove, or 13approve with modifications a gas company's plan to relocate any gas service regulator after considering certain factors; authorizing the Commission to exempt a 14 15gas service regulator from relocation if the Commission finds that an exemption is warranted after considering certain factors; authorizing the Commission to delegate 16 17the authority to grant a certain exemption to the Commission's technical staff division; requiring a gas company, on or before a certain date each year, beginning 18 19in a certain year, to report to the Commission on progress through the end of the 20immediately preceding calendar year related to implementing a certain plan; 21requiring the Commission to submit a certain report to the Governor and the General 22Assembly on or before a certain date each year, beginning in a certain year; providing 23for the application of this Act; stating the intent of the General Assembly; requiring 24certain gas service regulators to be enclosed in a certain manner under certain
