A BILL

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Increasing Access to5 SNAP Delivery During COVID-19 Act of 2020".

6 SEC. 2. FOOD DELIVERY UNDER SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRI-

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AUTHENTICATED U.S. GOVERNMENT INFORMATION

TION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

8 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

1	(1) EMPLOYEE.—The term "employee" has the
2	meaning given the term in section 3 of the Fair
3	Labor Standards Act of 1938 (29 U.S.C. 203).
4	(2) PROGRAM.—The term "program" means
5	the supplemental nutrition assistance program es-
6	tablished under the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008
7	(7 U.S.C. 2011 et seq.).
8	(3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
9	the Secretary of Agriculture.
10	(b) Program Modifications.—
11	(1) IN GENERAL.—In carrying out the program,
12	the Secretary shall—
13	(A) notify authorized program retailers of
14	existing opportunities through which retailers
15	can deliver food to program participants, in-
16	cluding by—
17	(i) allowing an EBT card (as defined
18	in section 3 of the Food and Nutrition Act
19	of 2008 (7 U.S.C. 2012)) to be swiped on
20	delivery of food to the home (with a mobile
21	device); and
22	(ii) preparing food for pick-up;
23	(B) authorize public-private partnerships
24	between the Department of Agriculture, author-
25	ized program retailers, and community-based

1	organizations to support food delivery, including
2	through the use of private funds;
3	(C) in the case of an authorized program
4	retailer that is unable to cover the cost of food
5	delivery for program participants, use funds
6	made available under paragraph (3)(B) to sup-
7	port food delivery for program participants who
8	are seniors, immunocompromised individuals, or
9	other individuals who are unable to travel safely
10	to an authorized program retailer, in accord-
11	ance with paragraph $(3)(A)$; and
12	(D) require each State to submit to the
13	Secretary a State plan that describes how the
14	State will—
15	(i) work with authorized program re-
16	tailers and other community-based part-
17	ners to establish a process for food delivery
18	for program participants;
19	(ii) administer the reimbursements de-
20	scribed in paragraph (3)(A)(i), including
21	timing, eligibility, and distribution proc-
22	esses; and
23	(iii) ensure that authorized program
24	retailers that are reimbursed for delivery
25	costs under paragraph (3)(A)(i) adhere to

1	the requirements described in paragraph
2	(3)(A)(ii).
3	(2) STATE PLANS.—Not later than 10 days
4	after the date on which the Secretary receives a
5	State plan under paragraph (1)(D), the Secretary
6	shall—
7	(A) approve or deny the State plan; and
8	(B) make publicly available on the website
9	of the Department of Agriculture—
10	(i) the State plan;
11	(ii) the determination made under
12	subparagraph (A) with respect to that
13	plan; and
14	(iii) any guidance issued to the State
15	with respect to that plan.
16	(3) FOOD DELIVERY.—
17	(A) Reimbursement of retailers.—
18	(i) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding
19	any other provision of law, a State agency
20	shall reimburse an authorized program re-
21	tailer described in paragraph $(1)(C)$ for the
22	cost of food delivery to program partici-
23	pants described in that paragraph if—

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1	(I) the authorized program re-
2	tailer is eligible for reimbursement
3	under clause (ii); and
4	(II) the majority of the food
5	items delivered by the retailer are eli-
6	gible for redemption using benefits
7	under the program.
8	(ii) ELIGIBILITY.—An authorized pro-
9	gram retailer described in paragraph
10	(1)(C) is eligible for reimbursement for the
11	cost of food delivery to program partici-
12	pants described in that paragraph if—
13	(I) that food delivery is per-
14	formed by employees of the retailer or
15	employees of an entity contracted by
16	the retailer to perform deliveries;
17	(II) before any employee de-
18	scribed in subclause (I) begins making
19	that food delivery, that employee re-
20	ceives employer-provided health and
21	safety training that reflects the most
22	recent guidelines of the Centers for
23	Disease Control and Prevention and
24	the Occupational Safety and Health
25	Administration relating to worker

and 1 safety health during the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-2 19) pandemic; 3 4 (III) the retailer remains neutral in any union organizing effort that oc-5 curs during the period in which deliv-6 7 eries described in paragraph (1)(C)are made; and 8 9 (IV) all employees described in 10 subclause (I) performing deliveries are 11 paid at a rate that is not less than the 12 greater of— 13 (aa) the minimum wage rate 14 established under section 6(a)(1)15 of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (29 U.S.C. 206(a)(1)); 16 17 and 18 (bb) the minimum wage rate 19 by the established applicable 20 State or locality in which the employee works. 21 22 (iii) COVERED COSTS.— 23 (I) IN GENERAL.—Reimbursable 24 costs under clause (i) include costs as-

sociated with—

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1	(aa) purchasing point-of-sale
2	devices or receiving technical as-
3	sistance relating to point-of-sale
4	devices; and
5	(bb) purchasing or reimburs-
6	ing employees for personal pro-
7	tective equipment used during
8	food delivery.
9	(II) PPE costs.—An authorized
10	program retailer shall use not more
11	than 10 percent of amounts received
12	under clause (i) to pay for the costs
13	described in subclause (I)(bb).
14	(iv) Maximum reimbursement per
15	DELIVERY.—The maximum amount of re-
16	imbursement under clause (i) for a food
17	delivery fee shall be \$10 per delivery.
18	(B) FUNDING.—
19	(i) IN GENERAL.—There is appro-
20	priated to the Secretary, out of funds of
21	the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,
22	\$500,000,000 to cover the cost of food de-
23	livery described in paragraph $(1)(C)$, to be
24	distributed among the States to fund reim-

- bursements by States under subparagraph (A)(i).
- 3 (ii) EMERGENCY REQUIREMENT.—The
 4 amount made available under clause (i) is
 5 designated by the Congress as being for an
 6 emergency requirement pursuant to section
 7 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget
 8 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of
 9 1985 (2 U.S.C. 901(b)(2)(A)(i)).

10 (iii) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIA-11 TIONS.—In addition to the amount appro-12 priated under clause (i), there are author-13 ized to be appropriated to the Secretary 14 such sums as are necessary to cover the 15 cost of food delivery under paragraph 16 (1)(C).

17 (4) TERMINATION OF AUTHORITY.—

18 (A) IN GENERAL.—The authority of the
19 Secretary to carry out paragraphs (1) through
20 (3) with respect to each State shall terminate
21 on the later of—

(i) the date on which the national
emergency declared by the President under
the National Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C.
1601 et seq.) with respect to the

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1	Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) is
2	terminated; and
3	(ii) the date on which the State emer-
4	gency declared in that State with respect
5	to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID–
6	19) is terminated.
7	(B) RETURN OF FUNDS.—The Secretary
8	shall return to the Treasury any funds appro-
9	priated under paragraph (3)(B)(i) that have not
10	been used or obligated by the date described in
11	subparagraph (A).
12	(5) Report.—Not later than 3 months after
13	the date on which the authority of the Secretary is
14	terminated under paragraph (4), the Secretary shall
15	submit to the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition,
16	and Forestry of the Senate and the Committee on
17	Agriculture of the House of Representatives a report
18	that describes—
19	(A) the use of that authority to address
20	food security needs of affected populations dur-
21	ing the national emergency described in sub-
22	paragraph (A)(i) of that paragraph;
23	(B) the authorized program retailers that
24	were reimbursed under paragraph (3)(A);

1(C) any complications or difficulties experi-2enced by States in administering reimburse-3ments under paragraph (3)(A); and4(D) recommendations for changes to the5authority of the Secretary under the Food and6Nutrition Act of 2008 (7 U.S.C. 2011 et seq.)7to assist the Secretary, States, and units of

local government to prepare plans for food delivery to program recipients in future health emergencies.

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
