A BILL

To repeal the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act
and the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act
of 2010 entirely.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “ObamaCare Repeal
5 Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF THE PATIENT PROTECTION AND AF-**
2 **FORDABLE CARE ACT AND THE HEALTH**
3 **CARE AND EDUCATION RECONCILIATION ACT**
4 **OF 2010.**

5 (a) PATIENT PROTECTION AND AFFORDABLE CARE
6 ACT.—Effective on January 1, 2018, the Patient Protec-
7 tion and Affordable Care Act (Public Law 111–148) is
8 repealed and the provisions of law amended or repealed
9 by such Act are restored or revived as if such Act had
10 not been enacted.

11 (b) HEALTH CARE AND EDUCATION RECONCILI-
12 ATION ACT OF 2010.—Effective on January 1, 2018, the
13 Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010
14 (Public Law 111–152) is repealed and the provisions of
15 law amended or repealed by such Act are restored or re-
16 vived as if such Act had not been enacted.

17 **SEC. 3. BUDGETARY EFFECTS OF THIS ACT.**

18 The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of
19 complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010,
20 shall be determined by reference to the latest statement
21 titled “Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation” for this
22 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record
23 by the Chairman of the Committee on the Budget of the
24 House of Representatives, as long as such statement has
25 been submitted prior to the vote on passage of this Act.
