A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Defense to standardize, collect, and analyze information on the demographics of applicants to military service academies, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Public Accountability
- 5 on Nominations Offered that Result in Admissions to Mili-
- 6 tary Academies Act of 2020" or the "PANORAMA Act
- 7 of 2020".

| 3 | (a) Congressional Nominations Portal.— |
| 4 | (1) In general.—Not later than one year |
| 5 | after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec- |
| 6 | retary, in consultation with the Superintendents of |
| 7 | the military service academies, shall ensure that |
| 8 | there is a uniform online portal for all military serv- |
| 9 | ice academies that enables Members of Congress to |
| 10 | nominate individuals for appointment to each acad- |
| 11 | emy through a secure website. |
| 12 | (2) Information collection and report- |
| 13 | ING.—The online portal established under paragraph |
| 14 | (1) shall— |
| 15 | (A) collect, from each Member of Con- |

| 18 | the Member; and |
| 19 | (B) collect the information required to be |
| 20 | included in each annual report of the Secretary |

| 24 | (3) AVAILABILITY OF INFORMATION.—The por- |
| 25 | tal shall allow Members of Congress and their des- |

- ignees to view past nomination records for all appli-cation cycles.
- 3 (b) STANDARD CLASSIFICATIONS FOR COLLECTION4 OF DEMOGRAPHIC DATA.—
 - (1) STANDARDS REQUIRED.—The Secretary, in consultation with the Superintendents of the military service academies, shall establish standard classifications that cadets, midshipmen, and applicants to the academies may use to self-identify gender, race, and ethnicity and to provide other demographic information in connection with admission to or enrollment in an academy.
 - (2) Consistency with omb guidance.—The standard classifications established under paragraph (1) shall be consistent with the standard classifications specified in Office of Management and Budget Directive No. 15 (pertaining to race and ethnic standards for Federal statistics and administrative reporting) or any successor directive.
 - (3) Incorporation into applications and Records.—Not later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall incorporate the standard classifications established under paragraph (1) into—

| 15 | (2) Elements.—Each report under paragraph |
| 16 | (1) shall include, with respect to each military serv- |
| 17 | ice academy, the following: |
| 18 | (A) The number of individuals who sub- |
| 19 | mitted an application for admission to the acad- |
| 20 | emy in the application year covered by the re- |
| 21 | port. |

| 10 | riod beginning on January 1 of one year and ending |
| 11 | on June 1 of the following year. |
| 12 | (2) The term "congressional defense commit- |
| 13 | tees" has the meaning given that term in section |
| 14 | 101(a)(16) of title 10, United States Code. |
| 15 | (3) The term "machine-readable" has the |
| 16 | meaning given that term in section 3502(18) of title |
| 17 | 44, United States Code. |
| 18 | (4) The term "military service academy" |
| 19 | means— |
| 20 | (A) the United States Military Academy; |
| 21 | (B) the United States Naval Academy; and |
| 22 | (C) the United States Air Force Academy. |
| 23 | (5) The term "Secretary" means the Secretary |
| 24 | of Defense |
