CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

Home Energy Assistance - Critical Medical Needs Program - Power to the People Pilot Program

FOR the purpose of requiring the Office of Home Energy Programs, in coordination with 4 the United Way of Central Maryland and the Fuel Fund of Maryland, to establish $\mathbf{5}$ 6 the Power to the People Pilot Program on or before a certain date; stating the purpose 7 of the Pilot Program; requiring the Pilot Program to provide training for certain 8 individuals to serve as navigators under the Critical Medical Needs Program; 9 requiring the United Way of Central Maryland to develop a certain screening intake process; requiring certain intake specialists to perform certain duties; requiring the 10 Fuel Fund of Maryland to provide certain services; requiring the Governor to include 11 12a certain amount in the annual State budget for the Pilot Program; requiring that 13 certain funds be used in a certain manner; altering a certain definition; defining a 14certain term; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the 15Power to the People Pilot Program.

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1(5) "PILOT PROGRAM" MEANS THE POWER TO THE PEOPLE PILOT2PROGRAM ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SECTION.

- 3 (b) (1) There is a CMN Program in the Office.
- 4

(2) The Office shall implement and administer the CMN Program.

5 (3) In administering the CMN Program, the Office shall partner with the 6 Office of People's Counsel, the Fuel Fund of Central Maryland, the Cancer Support 7 Foundation, electric and gas companies, nonprofit organizations, other State agencies, the 8 health care community, and any other organization that the Office determines appropriate.

9 (4) The purpose of the CMN Program is to reduce the barriers to the energy 10 assistance application process for critical medically vulnerable individuals and their 11 households in obtaining State and federal financial assistance for their electric, gas, or 12 other energy source bills so that their electric, gas, or other energy source service continues 13 or is restored.

14 (c) (1) The CMN Program shall facilitate assistance to critical medically 15 vulnerable individuals and their households in obtaining State and federal financial 16 assistance for their electric, gas, or other source energy bills through navigators.

17 (2) The Office shall determine qualifications and establish training 18 requirements for navigators.

19(3)The Office shall train navigators or facilitate the training of navigators20by others.

(d) In accordance with the requirements set forth in the Code of Maryland
 Regulations, the Office shall work with electric and gas companies to implement, for critical
 medically vulnerable individuals:

(1) a medical hold on electric or gas service or an expedited process to grant
the extension of electric or gas service for those who will have their electric or gas services
terminated; and

27 (2) an expedited process for the restoration of electric or gas service for28 those who have had their electric or gas service terminated.

(e) The Office shall establish a tracking system of the status of critical medically
 30 vulnerable individuals who participate in the CMN Program.

(F) (1) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2022, THE OFFICE, IN COORDINATION WITH THE UNITED WAY OF CENTRAL MARYLAND AND THE FUEL FUND OF MARYLAND, SHALL ESTABLISH THE POWER TO THE PEOPLE PILOT PROGRAM. 1 (2) THE PURPOSE OF THE PILOT PROGRAM IS TO EXPAND ACCESS TO 2 THE CMN PROGRAM.

3 (3) THE PILOT PROGRAM SHALL PROVIDE TRAINING FOR 2-1-1
 4 MARYLAND UNITED WAY HELPLINE INTAKE SPECIALISTS AND CASE MANAGERS TO
 5 SERVE AS NAVIGATORS.

6 (4) THE UNITED WAY OF CENTRAL MARYLAND SHALL ESTABLISH A 7 SCREENING INTAKE PROCESS TO IDENTIFY CALLERS TO THE 2–1–1 MARYLAND 8 UNITED WAY HELPLINE WHO MAY BE CRITICAL MEDICALLY VULNERABLE 9 INDIVIDUALS.

10 (5) 2–1–1 MARYLAND UNITED WAY HELPLINE INTAKE SPECIALISTS 11 SHALL:

12(I)CONDUCT BASIC SCREENING TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE13CALLER IS A CRITICAL MEDICALLY VULNERABLE INDIVIDUAL;

14(II) ASSIST CRITICAL MEDICALLY VULNERABLE INDIVIDUALS15AND THEIR HOUSEHOLDS WITH:

(6) THE FUEL FUND OF MARYLAND SHALL:

(I) COORDINATE WITH THE OFFICE AND THE UNITED WAY OF
 CENTRAL MARYLAND TO ASSIST CRITICAL MEDICALLY VULNERABLE INDIVIDUALS
 WITH PAYING ANY REMAINING BALANCE OWED ON THEIR ELECTRIC, GAS, OR OTHER
 ENERGY SOURCE BILLS; AND

28(II) PROVIDE ADDITIONAL CASH ASSISTANCE AND COMMUNITY29RESOURCES TO CRITICAL MEDICALLY VULNERABLE INDIVIDUALS.

(7) (I) FOR FISCAL YEARS 2023 AND 2024, THE GOVERNOR SHALL
 INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION OF \$80,000 TO THE
 OFFICE FOR THE PILOT PROGRAM.
