I	A RESOLUTION urging the Federal Communications Commission to adopt the
2	988 quick hotline number for suicide prevention.
3	WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reports that
4	more than 47,000 people died by suicide and more than 1.4 million adults attempted
5	suicide in the United States in 2017 alone; and
6	WHEREAS, according to the CDC, from 1999 to 2016, suicide increased in 49 of
7	the 50 states, and in more than half of those states, the increase was greater than 20
8	percent; and
9	WHEREAS, suicide rates are higher across various at-risk populations, including
10	veterans and Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer (LGBTQ) communities,
11	and teens; and
12	WHEREAS, more than 20 veterans die by suicide every day and between 2008 and
13	2016, there were more than 6,000 veteran suicides each year; and
14	WHEREAS, suicide is the second most common cause of death among teenagers
15	and young adults; and
16	WHEREAS, in 2017, the rate of suicides by teenage girls hit a 40-year high, and
17	between 1999 and 2014, the rate of suicide committed by girls ages 10 to 14 tripled; and
18	WHEREAS, a recent study also found that self-reported suicide attempts among
19	black teens increased by 73 percent between 1991 and 2017; and
20	WHEREAS, suicide rates are higher in the rural United States; in 2017, the suicide
21	rate for the most rural counties was 1.8 times the rate for the most urban counties in the
22	country; and
23	WHEREAS, in Kentucky in 2019, suicide was the second leading cause of death for
24	people aged 15 to 34 years; and
25	WHEREAS, in 2017 there were 770 deaths by suicide in Kentucky; more than four
26	times the number of people who died in alcohol related motor vehicle crashes; and
27	WHEREAS, data from 1,507 monitored calls from 1,140 suicidal individuals across

1 17 crisis centers showed that callers were significantly more likely to feel less depressed,

- 2 less suicidal, less overwhelmed and more hopeful by the end of calls; and
- WHEREAS, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration
- 4 concluded that designating a three digit number for a national suicide prevention and
- 5 mental health crisis hotline has the potential to play a key role in improving national crisis
- 6 intervention and suicide prevention efforts;
- 7 NOW, THEREFORE,
- 8 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
- 9 Commonwealth of Kentucky:
- → Section 1. The Kentucky House of Representatives respectfully urges the
- 11 Federal Communications Commission to adopt 988 as the three digit dialing code for a
- 12 national suicide and mental health crisis hotline system.
- → Section 2. The Clerk of the House of Representatives is directed to transmit a
