## A BILL

To require the Internal Revenue Service to provide Congress with sufficient notice prior to the closing of any Taxpayer Assistance Center.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. NOTICE FROM IRS REGARDING CLOSURE OF
- 4 TAXPAYER ASSISTANCE CENTERS.
- 5 Not later than 90 days before the date that a pro-
- 6 posed closure of a Taxpayer Assistance Center would take
- 7 effect, the Secretary of the Treasury or the Secretary's
- 8 delegate shall submit a report to the Committee on Ways
- 9 and Means of the House of Representatives and the Com-
- 10 mittee on Finance of the Senate which provides the rea-

- 1 sons for the proposed closure and a description of the tax-
- 2 payer assistance services which will be provided by the In-
- 3 ternal Revenue Service after the proposed closure takes
- 4 effect to taxpayers in any rural city, town, or unincor-
- 5 porated area which has a population of not more than
- 6 50,000 inhabitants and would be affected by the proposed

7 closure.
