BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.931 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants	8
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to	9

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar collects in the fund as follows:

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The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or other abortion-related activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 37 receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 38 organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 39 deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 40 organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 41 the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 42 manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 43 other money in that fund. 44

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 45
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 46
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 47
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 48

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	49
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the	50

amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley	52
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These	53
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to	54

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the

contributions for its research and other programs.	78

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar	109

from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general	114
scholarship fund.	115

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 125 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 126 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 127 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 128 cyclists of all ages.

The school district shall use the 438 contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 439 440 providing services to the school district's students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 441 of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 442 443 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 444 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 445 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 446 superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 447 discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 448 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 449 that the school district hires to provide those services. The 450 school district also may use the contributions it receives to 451 pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 452 training in providing such services to the students of the 453 school district. The school district shall ensure that any 454 charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 455 from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 456 Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 457 contributions it receives for any other purpose. 458

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 459 receives pursuant to section 4503.873 of the Revised Code to 460 Padua Franciscan high school located in the municipal 461

corporation of Parma. The school shall use fifty per cent of the	462
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its	463
students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to	464
pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's	465
students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and	466
emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may	467
include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving	468
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and	469
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug	470
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of	471
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the	472
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those	473

The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 487 pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 488 students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 489 emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 490 include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 491 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 492

education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug	493
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of	494
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the	495
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those	496
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's	497
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any	498
charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those	499
services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable	500
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under	501
