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20	(1) The state board shall establish rules and minimum standards for the public schools
29	that are consistent with this public education code, including rules and minimum standards
30	governing the following:
31	(a) (i) the qualification and certification of educators and ancillary personnel who
32	provide direct student services;
33	(ii) required school administrative and supervisory services; and
34	(iii) the evaluation of instructional personnel;
35	(b) (i) access to programs;
36	(ii) attendance;
37	(iii) competency levels;
38	(iv) graduation requirements; and
39	(v) discipline and control;
