A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on Juvenile Court Judges; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the safety and welfare of Georgia's citizens and property are best be served by
- 3 dedicated and competent juvenile court judges who fairly balance the needs of children with
- 4 the needs of the community and those who have been victims of delinquent acts committed
- 5 by children; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the Juvenile Code, Chapter 11 of Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 7 Annotated, was comprehensively rewritten in 2013; and
- 8 WHEREAS, juvenile court judges, child advocate attorneys, juvenile public defenders and
- 9 attorneys who represent children, prosecuting attorneys, child welfare practitioners, law
- 10 enforcement officials, and state policymakers have recognized the necessity of reviewing the
- 11 current laws as applied to the compensation of juvenile court judges, their appointment,
- 12 qualifications, and governance; and
- 13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 14 (1) **Creation of House study committee.** There is created the House Study Committee
- on Juvenile Court Judges.
- 16 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of 10 members as
- 17 follows:
- 18 (A) Three members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives,
- one of whom shall be designated chairperson;
- 20 (B) Two juvenile court judges to be appointed by the Council of Juvenile Court Judges;
- 21 (C) One superior court judge, who previously served as a juvenile court judge, to be
- appointed by the Council of Superior Court Judges;
- 23 (D) The commissioner of the Department of Juvenile Justice or his or her designee;
- 24 (E) The executive director of the Prosecuting Attorneys' Council or his or her designee;
- 25 (F) The executive director of the Public Defenders Council or his or her designee; and

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26 (G) One special assistant attorney general who regularly handles juvenile court proceedings, to be appointed by the Attorney General.

- (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs, issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 31 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

35 (5) Allowances and funding.

- 36 Members of the committee who are members of the General Assembly shall receive the
- 37 allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 38 Annotated. The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any
- member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized.
- Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
- appropriated to the House of Representatives.

42 (6) **Report.**

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- 43 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
- include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
- same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
- subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- 47 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
- proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
- 49 of this paragraph.
- 50 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
- abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
- the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- 54 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the
- House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu
- 56 thereof.
- 57 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2018.
